MEMBERSHIP NEWS

Greenery is everywhere now! Winter is losing its icy grip and warmer days mean trips to the shooting ranges! Turkey season is here and there will be lots of time spent on the Plinking Range for sighting in and patterning those turkey guns and 22s for Squirrel season next month. You can expect that all of the ranges will experience increased traffic as balmy weather invites us to take advantage of ORSA's diverse shooting ranges for enjoying our shooting sports. Plan ahead to use ORSA's facilities during low attendance weekday afternoons or early mornings thus avoiding any delays in getting to shoot as other people also want to experience the nice weather – especially on weekends.

I am often asked questions about being a bondholder. ORSA bonds occasionally become available when members pass away or decide to sell theirs due to becoming less involved in using ORSA ranges over time. ORSA bonds cost \$100 each and do not pay interest. Their value to Bondholders is that they are able to participate in some ORSA operational decisions like land acquisitions and can get reduced ORSA dues after becoming 65 years old. Bonds do not become available very often. However, if you are interested in becoming a bondholder contact Linda Albrecht the ORSA Secretary at orsasec@gmail.org to get placed on the waiting list.

Two questions that occasionally arise are “Why do Spouses need to fill out application forms to obtain a Spouse Badge” and “Why do Spouses need to attend Orientation?” The answer is simply that we treat all ORSA members equally and have the same expected requirements for safety and rules compliance for both the primary ORSA member and their Spouse. In addition, spouses often have interests in different shooting sports and we need to have their unique phone numbers and email addresses for communications regarding shooting events or changes to ORSA operational rules. Because Spouses are given identical access to shooting ranges, they need to attend Orientation to assure thorough knowledge of all safety rules and range operations issues.

Safe shooting is our first priority at ORSA. Lets' make sure we shoot responsibly and safely.

CIVILIAN MARKSMANSHIP PROGRAM (CMP) SERVICE RIFLE CLINIC

APRIL 21ST, 8:00 AM – ORSA INDOOR RANGE

The ORSA Rifle and Pistol Club will conduct a CMP Service Rifle Clinic on April 21st. You will learn to fire a Service Rifle accurately without the need for sand bags or a bipod. It's not magic or an unattainable skill. ORSA High Power Service Rifle and Long-Range Rifle shooters routinely place 20 shots in groups smaller than the size of a dinner plate at 600 yards. You will receive one-on-one instruction from experienced competitors.

If you would like to learn about how to get started in this sport, please plan to join us on Saturday, May 6th at 8:00 AM at the ORSA Indoor Range. You may bring your own US Service Rifle (AR-15, M1-Garand, or M1-A and ammo); or, use a club rifle and ammo. If you bring your gear, cost is \$5.00. If you are using ORSA rifle, ammo, and equipment; cost is \$30.00.

If you wish to participate, please read and follow the instructions below. RSVP to Alan Strachn at: alanstrachn@gmail.com. Answer the following questions:

- What is your Name, email address, and are you 18 or older?
- Are you furnishing your own rifle and ammo?
- Will you need a club AR-15? (note, only club ammo may only be fired in these rifles)
- What is your suit jacket size? (helps us fit you with a shooting jacket)
- Are you left-handed?

Please Read and Follow These Instructions:

- Schedule: Report to the ORSA Indoor Range at 8:00 AM Saturday, March 17th.
- You will register, be fitted with a shooting jacket and mitt, be assigned a Relay and Target, and be paired with a coach. Additionally, an introductory course of instruction will be provided.

Course of Fire: All Firing Conducted from 200 Yards

- 5 prone slow fire sighter shots
- 10 shots prone slow fire
- 10 shots rapid fire fired from the prone position with a magazine change
- 10 shots rapid fire fired from the sitting position with a magazine change
- 10 shots slow fire standing

Fees:

- \$30.00 for club rifle, ammo, and equipment
- \$5.00 if participant brings their own rifle, equipment and ammo

Range Requirements, Safety, and Comfort:

- Eye and Ear Protection are Required on all ORSA Ranges and must be furnished by participants
- Dress for the weather predicted
- Bring plenty to drink, and a light lunch

WE ARE ALL RESPONSIBLE

As we enter the ORSA 2018 Spring and Summer seasons for outdoor recreational and competitive shooting, it's important to refamiliarize ourselves with the rules and administrative policies governing ORSA member use of our superb range facilities. As members we are responsible for understanding, following and enforcing the rules of the ranges we shoot on.

Most of our ranges have the rules associated with their use prominently posted. Please take a few minutes to review them. Anyone saying, "I didn't know," is only confirming they failed to read and understand the rules. Several rules common to all shooting disciplines at ORSA warrant highlighting as they are non-negotiables. They are:

1. **ALWAYS** keep firearms pointed in a safe direction.
2. **ALWAYS** keep your finger off the trigger until ready to shoot.
3. **ALWAYS** keep the firearm unloaded until ready to use.
4. Eye and hearing protection **MUST BE WORN** on all ORSA ranges.
5. **Alcohol use on all ORSA ranges (including range parking lots) is PROHIBITED.**
6. **Everyone is a safety officer.** If a safety infraction occurs, call a "cease fire" and remediate the infraction.



ORSA has several high-use ranges. Among them, the Bench Rest and Plinking Ranges. Given the high volume of use, an inordinate number of rules and safety infractions occur on these ranges. Both ranges have red safety strobes installed that must be activated when the ranges are placed in a "cold status" or when a "cease fire" is called. When the strobes are activated, the following are non-negotiable safety requirements:

1. All firearms must be placed in a "safe status." Meaning: (a) magazines and ammunition have been cleared from firearms; (b) firearm safety mechanisms are on "Safe;" (c) firearm actions (or cylinders) are open and facing up on the bench; and (d) Empty Chamber Indicators (ECI's) are inserted through firearm open actions.
2. Before anyone is cleared to go down range, all firearms must be verified to be in a "safe status."

3. **Absolutely no handling of firearms while personnel are down range.**
4. Before the range is brought back to a hot status, all personnel on the firing line must confirm that no one is down range. Only then can the red strobes be turned off and the range be declared "hot."

Finally, **we are all responsible for cleaning up after ourselves.** All brass and ammunition refuse must be policed. **All targetry used must be removed from backer boards on the Bench Rest Range** before departure. And **all target material brought onto the Plinking Range must be policed and be placed in garbage cans or in the dumpster. This is not happening in a satisfactory manner!**



As noted several times, we are all responsible for understanding and enforcing ORSA rules and regulations. If you observe an infraction, diplomatically ask the person committing the infraction to take corrective action. If the individual fails to comply or becomes belligerent, ask to see their ORSA Badge (ORSA regulations require ORSA Badges be worn at all times). Get their name and ORSA Badge number or take a photo of the badge; note the date and time, and immediately get the information to the respective club president. On-site cameras will be reviewed to confirm the infraction/s. Should this occur, the individual/s committing the infraction will receive a summons to appear before the ORSA Board of Directors to explain their failure to comply with range rules. The board will then determine if ORSA membership revocation is warranted.

If we all do the right thing and accept responsibility for our actions, we can all enjoy a safe and enjoyable 2018 shooting season. See you on the range.

WHY ARE WHITE MEN STOCKPILING GUNS

“Since the 2008 election of President Obama, the number of firearms manufactured in the U.S. has tripled, while imports have doubled. This doesn’t mean more households have guns than ever before—that percentage has stayed fairly steady for decades. Rather, more guns are being stockpiled by a small number of individuals. Three percent of the population now owns half of the country’s firearms, says a recent, definitive study from the Injury Control Research Center at Harvard University.

So, who is buying all these guns—and why? The short, broad-brush answer to the first part of that question is this: men, who on average possess almost twice the number of guns female

owners do. But not all men. Some groups of men are much more avid gun consumers than others. The American citizen most likely to own a gun is a white male—but not just any white guy. According to a growing number of scientific studies, the kind of man who stockpiles weapons or applies for a concealed-carry license meets a very specific profile.

These are men who are anxious about their ability to protect their families, insecure about their place in the job market, and beset by racial fears. They tend to be less educated. For the most part, they don’t appear to be religious—and, suggests one study, faith seems to reduce their attachment to guns. In fact, stockpiling guns seems to be a symptom of a much deeper crisis in meaning and purpose in their lives. Taken together, these studies describe a population that is struggling to find a new story—one in which they are once again the heroes.”

We have another shooting in a so called gun free zone, and the gun banners and anti-Second Amendment crowd are now in full throated opposition to the freedoms of millions of us law abiding American citizens. In 1964, Colt began selling its own version with an improved semi-automatic design known as the Colt AR-15. After Colt’s patents expired in 1977, an active marketplace emerged for other manufacturers to produce and sell their own AR-15 style sporting rifles. So now you know – AR stands for

ArmaLite, the company who originally designed the weapon style.

3. A small number of factors significantly increase the likelihood that a person will be a victim of a gun-related homicide.
4. Gun-related murders are carried out by a predictable pool of people.
5. Higher rates of gun ownership are not associated with higher rates of violent crime.
6. There is no clear relationship between strict gun control legislation and homicide or violent crime rates.
7. Legally owned firearms are used for lawful purposes much more often than they are used to commit crimes or suicide.
8. Concealed carry permit holders are not the problem, but they may be part of the solution.
