APRIL 5, 2020: 100 sporting clays targets at the ORSA sporting clays course off Gum Hollow Road.

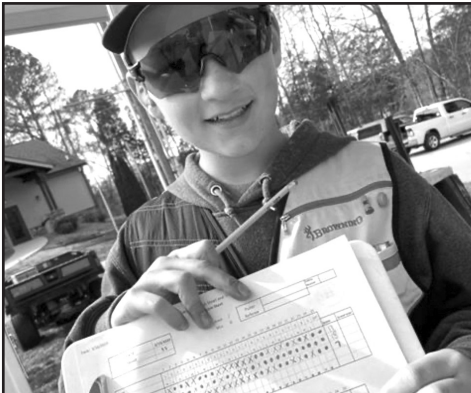
Please be aware that when schools in Anderson, Roane & Knox counties are closed for weather the ST&SC ranges will not be open.

YOUNG SHOOTER HIGHLIGHT: HAYDEN GRINDSTAFF

In the second of our series on young shooting athletes, we'd like to introduce you to Hayden Grindstaff. Hayden is a man of many talents and interests. He's one of those quiet guys that just goes about his business without much fanfare. But the more you interact with him, the more interesting he is.

Hayden hails from South Knoxville. He played traditional sports as a kid, and was a recreational shooter with his family. For several years, baseball was his passion and he was very accomplished, but in his junior year he found his way back onto the trap field and onto the sporting clays range.

Hayden, now 21, is a Junior at Mississippi State working on a Mechanical Engineering Degree through Austin Peay and their transfer program. He's pretty smart too, maintaining a 3.63 GPA.

But he's a "hands on" type of guy. Recently, he began to think about using his talents to build himself a custom firearm. He'd seen the high-end AR rifles in the magazines, on TV and on YouTube, and thought how fun and cool it might be to have one of his own. So, he did his research, bought his components and he and his father, Stacey, built two high-quality rifles as a father/son project.



When Hayden is not on the trap line, the building bench or at the study desk, he also has a job working in airfield maintenance at McGhee Tyson airport, so he's a very busy man.

After graduation next year, Hayden is looking to go into the machining and fabrication end of mechanical engineering. His practical skills and engineering knowledge will prove to be very valuable to whatever company that secures him as part of their team.

At school, his sports of trap and sporting clays are of great interest to Hayden's peers; most of whom have never participated in organized clay target sports. His most proud accomplishment was shooting his first perfect 25 in trap last year, after a seemingly never-ending string of 24s. Hayden says that the shooting sports have been a "good way to grow in confidence and meet some good friends along the way".

Going forward, Hayden would like to give 3 gun a try to stretch the performance of his AR(s), as well as continue to just have fun with the firearms. Given

Hayden's busy schedule, you never know where you might run into him, but when you do, please let him know how much you appreciate his hard work and dedication.

CIVILIAN MARKSMANSHIP PROGRAM (CMP) SERVICE RIFLE CLINIC

MARCH 21 AND APRIL 18, 2020, 8:00 AM

ORSA ED T. JOHNSON INDOOR RANGE FACILITY

The ORSA Rifle and Pistol Club will conduct its Spring 2020 CMP Service Rifle Clinics of the 2020 shooting season on March 21st and April 18th, 2020. You will learn to fire a Service Rifle accurately without the need for sand bags or a bipod. It's not magic, or an unattainable skill. ORSA High Power Service Rifle and Long-Range Rifle shooters routinely place 20 shots in groups smaller than the size of a dinner plate at 600 yards. You will receive one-on-one instruction from experienced competitors.

If you would like to learn how to get started in the high-power service rifle shooting disciplines, please plan to join us on Saturday March 21st or April 18th at 8:00 AM at ORSA's Ed T. Johnson Indoor Range Facility. You may bring your own US Service Rifle (AR-15, M1-Garand, or M1-A and ammo); or, use a club rifle and ammo. If you bring your gear, cost is \$5.00. If you are using an ORSA rifle, ammo, and equipment; cost is \$30.00.

If you wish to participate, please read and follow the instructions below.

ANSWER THE FOLLOWING QUESTIONS:

- What is your name, email address, and are you 12 or older?
- Are you furnishing your own rifle and ammo? If you are, what are you bringing? (see safety)
- Will you need a club AR-15? (note, only club ammo may be fired in club rifles)
- What is your suit jacket size? (helps us fit you with a shooting jacket)
- Are you left-handed?

PLEASE READ AND FOLLOW THESE INSTRUCTIONS:

- Schedule: Report to the ORSA Ed T. Johnson Indoor Range Facility at 8:00 AM Saturday, the day of the Clinic.
- You will register, receive an introductory course of instruction and will be assigned a shooting relay and target number
- Upon reporting to the firing line, you will be paired with a coach and fitted with a shooting jacket and mitt.

COURSE OF FIRE: ALL FIRING WILL BE CONDUCTED FROM THE 200 YARD LINE

- 5 prone slow fire sighter shots
- 10 shots prone slow fire
- 10 shots rapid fire fired from the prone position with a magazine change
- 10 shots rapid fire fired from the sitting position with a magazine change
- 10 shots slow fire standing

FEES: (CASH ONLY, PLEASE)

- \$30.00 for club rifle, ammo, and equipment
- \$5.00 if participant brings their own rifle, equipment and ammo

RANGE REQUIREMENTS, SAFETY, AND COMFORT:

- Eye and Ear Protection are required on all ORSA ranges and must be furnished by participants.
- Dress for the weather predicted, to include a hat and sunscreen. An inclement weather plan exists in the event of rain.
- No Muzzle Brakes, shooters and coaches are in close proximity to each other on the firing line.
- Bring plenty to drink, and a light lunch



LONG RANGE RIFLE CLINICS OAK RIDGE SPORTSMEN'S ASSOCIATION (ORSA) MARCH 22 AND SEPTEMBER 20, 2020

The ORSA Rifle and Pistol Club will conduct Long Range Rifle Clinics on March 22 and September 20, 2020. Please plan to attend one of our clinics if you have a basic understanding of rifle shooting and reloading and are interested in: learning what it takes to shoot long range; competing in long range matches; or just want to learn how to set up the High Power Range to shoot from the 1000 yard line. Both Prone and F-Class shooters are welcome. Cost for the clinic is \$10.

Your instructors are experienced long range shooters and members of the ORSA long range rifle team. All are NRA high masters. Several have won major national level matches such as the Wimbledon Cup and the Leech Cup.

The clinic will begin at 8:30am in the ORSA Clubhouse with a couple hours of discussion on various subjects as they relate to long range shooting. For instance, we will not teach you how to reload ammo but we will discuss what is needed to make that ammo reliable and consistent for long range shooting. We will not tell you what equipment to buy but we will share what has worked for us through many years of trial and error. We will discuss topics such as wind reading and calling your shots. We will discuss the pros and cons of different calibers. We will cover both optics and iron sights. We will also cover safety and range operation.

The clinic will then move to the 600 yard line to establish zeros on all the participants' rifles. We will run the firing line similar to an actual match. You will be expected to do pit duty. Once we have all rifles zeroed at 600 yards we will move back to the 1000 yard line. We recommend that all attendees bring at least 50 rounds of ammo to the clinic.

EQUIPMENT NEEDS:

Rifle and ammo capable of shooting 1000 yards. If bringing a .308 Win, please do not bring ammo loaded with 168g Sierra MatchKing bullets or clones of that bullet. The short boattail of that bullet tends to cause it to tumble beyond 800 yards and while it will hit the target, the erratic behavior can be dangerous to those in the pits. Match bullets are preferred as hunting bullets are generally not consistent at 1000 yards.

A spotting scope and mat to lay on are recommended if you have them. A rest or bipod is recommended if shooting F-class. The instructors may have extras of some items but they are the instructors' equipment and do not belong to the club.

Occasionally a student's rifle may not shoot from the 1000 yard line due to ammo limitations or sights not having adequate elevation adjustment. The instructors may have a rifle available for the students to fire a few rounds from just for the thrill of hitting the target from 1000 yards. These are privately owned rifles and ammo and no guarantees are made as to their availability. ORSA does not own any long range rifles.

Of course, eye and ear protection are required on the firing line and in the pits. You may also want to bring lunch and plenty of water as the clinic will run all day.

Larry may not always answer his phone but will always call you back as soon as he can if you leave a message. (you can blame too many robo-calls for that!)

Warning: hitting the target from 1000 yards has been known to produce uncontrolled giggles and grins.
