SPECIALTY LICENSE PLATE



There's a new way to support Smoky Mountain Service Dogs and let fellow motorists know you're doing so!

Smoky Mountain service dogs is pre-selling custom license plates to Tennessee residents with registered vehicles. The plate costs \$35.00 but \$15.37 of the cost benefits the organization directly. The state requires a minimum of 1000 pre-orders to start production of the new plate. After all orders are received, it will take up to three months to arrive at your local county clerk offices.

Important facts about Specialty Plates:

- The Department of Revenue will notify you when your plate is ready for pickup at your local county clerk's office.
- You should continue to renew your current license plate like you have in the past. When your new plate arrives at your county clerk's office, you will switch to your new plate. The time remaining on your current plate will be prorated so you will receive credit for months you have not used.
- \$15.37 of every plate purchased is given to SMSD. This provides ongoing financial support year after year to enable our organization to continue serving wounded veterans by placing Mobility Assistance dogs at NO charge to the veteran.
- For drivers who are approved and have documentation for handicapped plates, your local county clerk will provide you with a sticker to place in the bottom corner of the plate and has the exact function of the handicapped/disabled driver plates.

STUPID TWEET OF THE MONTH, YEAR, CENTURY - MAYBE EVER

*“An AR-15 is a semi automatic rifle. It shoots 13.4 bullets per second, 800 rounds per minute. It was created for the purpose of hitting multiple targets in a short amount of time, making it ideal for mass murder, It’s been used in the military to clear our areas in the Middle East for the reason above. Compare it to, say, a Glock 19 (a popular handgun, since you’re confused about it). This gun is small and holds a chamber big enough for 10 rounds of ammo. It is not an automatic or semi-automatic weapon, meaning it takes more time in between shots to be able to shoot again. The Glock 19 shoots less than a single bullet per second. It is used in homicides and burglaries, crimes with singular victims. It is not ideal for mass murder because of its inability to target multiple people at once. But you know what can? A f***** semi-automatic weapon”*

I’ve written the last several months about the Biden Administrations threats to our Second Amendment rights. I think all of you would agree that these are not idle threats as they have stated the threats openly, have passed legislation in the House, signed Executive Orders, and have majorities in both legislative bodies, and, of course, have the White House. If not stopped they will:

- Nominate radical, anti-constitutional federal judges and to the Supreme Court
- Act to ban common, constitutionally protected firearms and magazines
- Criminalize the private transfer of firearms
- Abuse executive authority to ban the importation of firearms, ammo, and accessories
- Ban gun-related speech, computer design, and 3D printing
- Ban home-building of firearms
- Empower the ATF and DOJ to persecute gun owners
- Direct the use of taxpayer dollars to fund anti-gun studies to support anti-gun policies
- Enact policies to eliminate the lawful acquisition of arms through normal sales channels
- Enact legislation to compel states to require gun and ammo purchasers to have licenses
- Promote and enact “Red Flag” laws
- Radically expand classes of persons prohibited from owning arms and ammo
- Enact policy/legislation for restrictions on gun owners who have children
- Make gun ownership prohibitively expensive for the average American
- Repeal legislation that protects gun manufacturers and retailers from frivolous lawsuits
- Require all firearms to contain expensive and unreliable “smart gun” technology

SO WHAT DO WE DO?

I believe that we need to attack on three fronts. The first is to communicate with our Congressional Representative and two Senators. Sure, they are all Republican but they need to hear that we support the Second Amendment and oppose ANY restrictions being dreamed up by the Democrats and the Biden Administration. We need to let them know they need to stand strong and that we are watching. The second thing we need to do is to communicate with our state legislators and the governor. They made great strides this last legislative session but there is still much they can do. We need them to pass legislation that makes TN a Second Amendment Sanctuary State that will protect TN citizens from any Second Amendment infringements by the federal government. Several other states have already begun to go along that path. The third thing for us to do is to get involved with organizations that are fighting every day to protect our

EN BANC NINTH CIRCUIT COURT RULES GUN OWNER HAVE NO RIGHT TO CARRY

SAN FRANCISCO, CALIF --(Ammoland.com)- The Ninth Circuit ruled in Young v. The State of Hawaii that ruled that an individual does not have a right to bear arms outside the home.

In 2011, George Young applied for a firearm-carry license, but Hawaii denied his application. The state requires gun owners to show “the urgency or the need” to carry a firearm openly. The applicant must also be of good moral character and be “engaged in the protection of life and property.” Hawaii determined that Young did not meet these requirements.

Young applied to open carry a firearm because he wanted to protect himself and his family. Hawaii is a “may issue” state when it comes to concealed carry, and it is almost impossible for the average citizen to obtain a concealed carry permit. This decision means that the courts have made it virtually impossible to carry a gun for self-defense outside the home, stripping Hawaii’s citizens of the right to bear arms.

Young challenged Hawaii’s draconian gun laws by suing the state for violating his Second Amendment rights and the Due Process Clause of the Fourteenth Amendment. The district court upheld Hawaii’s statute. Young then appealed the decision to the Ninth Circuit Court. The Ninth Circuit is also the court hearing blockbuster cases such as Miller v. Becerra and Duncan v. Becerra.

A three-judge panel from the Ninth Circuit ruled in favor of Young, stating that the state could not ban the open carrying of firearms in a two to one decision. The Ninth Circuit court immediately stayed the decision and granted an en banc review. SCOTUS DECISION ON HAWAII CARRY CASE WILL TELL GUN OWNERS ALL THEY NEED TO KNOW

U.S.A. – (Ammoland.com)- “This petition presents the same issue presented in New York State Rifle & Pistol Association, Inc., v. Corlett ... Like the New York statutory scheme at issue in NYSRPA, Hawaii maintains a statutory scheme that denies permits to ordinary law-abiding persons who seek to carry a firearm (openly or concealed) outside the home for self-defense,” attorneys Alan Beck and Stephen Stamboulieh argue in a Petition for Writ of Certiorari filed Tuesday in the Supreme Court of the United States. “Indeed, unlike the New York scheme, where some permits actually have been issued, Hawaii’s scheme is a permitting system in name only, because the statute has been used to deny all permit applications during the nine years this case has been in litigation.”

The case is *Young v. Hawaii*, an in-your-face denial of the right to bear arms covered extensively by AmmoLand Shooting Sports News. George Young, a native Hawaiian and Vietnam infantry veteran has been trying since 2007 to have his right to carry either openly or concealed recognized, having filed three federal lawsuits (this case is his third) over the state’s deliberately unused handgun carry law. In March, an 11-judge panel of the Ninth Circuit Court of Appeals struck down an earlier ruling that Hawaii’s firearm restriction was unconstitutional, declaring “There is no right to carry arms openly in public; nor is any such right within the scope of the Second Amendment.”

“The Ninth Circuit’s opinion, which finds the Second Amendment right does not apply outside the home at all, contradicts the decisions of every federal circuit court in the country that has ruled on this issue,” attorney Beck told Courthouse News after the decision was handed down. “We will be seeking Supreme Court review in order to overturn the Ninth Circuit’s erroneous decision.”

After procedural responses, we will see if SCOTUS takes on the case or denies it without a word in another act of deliberate indifference — the Roberts court has disappointed in the past. Questions about the Chief Justice have eroded confidence in the courts being a venue where recourse for gun owners is possible.

Add to that questions about the new judges added by Donald Trump, Neil Gorsuch, Brett Kavanaugh, and Amy Coney Barrett. When are we going to see some of that pro-Second Amendment fidelity our national “gun advocacy” groups were promising us was just around the corner when they were exhorting us to loudly support their confirmations?

If SCOTUS either punts on or rules against George Young, gun owners will have their answers.

NEARLY HALF OF ALL U.S. COUNTIES ARE NOW SECOND AMENDMENT SANCTUARIES

USA – (AmmoLand.com)- What the media isn’t telling you: Nearly half of all U.S. Counties are now Second Amendment Sanctuaries!

The mainstream media has missed [read: purposely ignored] one of the biggest trend stories ever – the massive surge in Second Amendment Sanctuaries at the state, county, and local level.

As it stands now, more than 46% of all counties in the United States have declared themselves Second Amendment Sanctuaries, according to Noah Davis of sanctuarycounties.com and its companion site constitutionalsanctuaries.com.

“There are 1,459 Second Amendment Sanctuary counties, out of a total of 3,144 counties, but I’m still tallying them right now,” Davis told me Wednesday. “I’ve got a bit of a backlog. I’m working on updating my national map, but they’re happening so fast, and I’m just one person in Virginia.”

The 1,459 includes counties located in the 10 states that have declared themselves Second Amendment Sanctuaries, he explained.

You’d be hard-pressed to get half of America to agree that beer is good, or that steak should be served medium-rare. Yet millions of Americans have forced their elected officials to erect a legislative wall around their communities to protect their gun rights.

Most Second Amendment Sanctuary bills are simple. They declare that the municipal, county, or state government simply won’t recognize or enforce any federal law that infringes upon the Second Amendment. Many of these laws bar local officials from participating in any federal enforcement. Some add civil and criminal penalties. A few would criminalize the actions of federal agents if they try to enforce federal gun laws, but many say this is a step too far, as it could spark costly lawsuits from the U.S. Justice Department. <https://www.ammoland.com/2021/05/half-of-us-counties-second-amendment-sanctuaries/#ixzz6uCGhTBVv>

CONCEALED CARRY BANNED UNDER 3RD PROPOSED COLORADO GUN CONTROL BILL

Colorado – (AmmoLand.com)- Two of three newly introduced gun control bills have passed their first hurdles. Bills HB21-1298: (even more) Expanded Firearm Transfer Background Check Requirements and HB21-1299: Creates The Office Of Gun Violence both passed their respective committees and will move on to Second Reading and debate on the house floor. 1298 is scheduled for Second Reading the morning of Tuesday, May 11 (laid over from today) and 1299 has not yet been scheduled.

So, a quick recap: After a madman murdered 10 people in a grocery store, in a state where violent crime is skyrocketing, the solution lawmakers have come up with to prevent tragedies like this from happening again is to strip responsible gun owners, and those worried for their own self-protection, of their right to self-defense in their own towns, counties, and even on college campuses where 1 in 5 women are sexually assaulted.

Many may think this bill is a knee-jerk reaction, but have no doubt, it is an intentional swipe at the firearm preemption law that has been in place since 2003. Ten days before the Boulder King Soopers shooting, a Boulder County District Judge overturned a City of Boulder ordinance banning so-called “assault weapons” along with magazines over 10 rounds. Virtue signaling gun grabbers like to use this example as to why the preemption law needs repealed. What they fail to mention is Boulder’s own set of gun laws would have done nothing to stop the shooter. He didn’t live in Boulder. He didn’t purchase his firearm in Boulder. The heinous acts he committed are already highly illegal and would have carried a maximum sentence of the death penalty had Colorado not repealed it in 2020. The only other crime committed by the Boulder shooter that would have been covered under Boulder’s own specific town laws is the open carrying of a long gun outside of the vehicle in the King Soopers parking lot – before he began his massacre. That part of the Boulder ordinance was NOT overturned by the judge, yet the Boulder DA has not added it to his list of charges. The Boulder DA also has not added the crime of lying on ATF Form 4473 which the shooter did when he answered yes to question 21(c): if he’d ever been convicted of a crime that carried a maximum penalty of 12 months or more in prison even if he received a lesser sentence including probation.

Rally for our Rights is a non-partisan gun rights advocacy organization that was founded in early 2018.
