## ORSA HIGH POWER HOSTS NRA REGIONAL FOR 2021

The ORSA High Power community worked diligently to host the return of the NRA Regional to Oak Ridge High Power Range the first weekend in June. The four days of shooting had participants that were new, seasoned, young and old, as well as featured the return of US Army Marksmanship unit this year. Last year's match was held but was not "officially sanctioned" by the NRA, but was called the "Bat Soup Regional."

Matches began on Thursday with the Army Marksmanship Unit (AMU) serving as coaches to any shooter that wanted coaching on how to become a better marksman. Class began at the club house and then moved to the range as we closely monitored the weather radar to avoid spotty showers. Friday consisted of the 4-man Team Match, which was handily won by the Army Marksmanship Unit, as well as earning second and third place spots. Saturday's Individual Match was also dominated by shooters of the Army Marksmanship Unit.

The Army's winning streak came to a partial end on Sunday for the 50 shot, no sighter, Excellence In Competition (EIC) Match. The EIC Match was held where shooters compete for awards from the Civilian Marksmanship Program (CMP) and earn points to become recognized as a Distinguished Rifleman. While the first-place award did go to SSG Brandon Muske of the AMU, who earned 8 points on his way to becoming Distinguished, the remaining three AMU competitors were shut out of other top spots by Oak Ridge regulars. Second Place went to previously Distinguished Rifleman Hailey Robinson from neighboring Polk County North Carolina Club. The third and fourth place competitors were ORSA members Drew Rowe and Bill Arnett, who both earned points on their way to becoming distinguished. Both Drew and Bill have previously earned points this past year, and we are confident they will earn the title "Distinguished Rifleman" soon. Congratulations to Drew and Bill!

**ORSA-NSSA 2021 YOUTH SKEET CLINIC**



Oak Ridge Sportsman Association along with the National Skeet Shooter's Association put on its **10th Annual Youth Skeet Camp** in Oak Ridge, Tennessee on June 7-8, 2021. Fifteen youth athletes attended the camp, and ages ranged from 8 to 17 years old. NSSA National Chief Youth Instructor Doug Thompson, along with five certified instructors from ORSA and North Carolina, put on the two-day camp.

**"Safety is the number one goal,"** said Rick Andrews Youth Camp Director. Safety briefings were held each day before the camp began along with the instructors stressing safety on the fields.

"After attending ten years of the ORSA-NSSA Youth skeet camp, I have to say it was another great year," said Doug Thompson. **"The entire staff of the club should be commended for their interest and unknown hours of dedication from all of their volunteers, without whom it could not occur.** I believe all of the youth received excellent instruction and everyone had a great time with a lot of improvements."

The camp offered instruction for beginners to advance shooters. Gun fitting, eye dominate, proper stance and advance technique were taught. ORSA skeet facility threw more than 3,400 targets during the clinic.

A new camp attendee Katie Evans commented, "I really enjoyed skeet camp. I learned a variety of things, such as where to point my barrel before calling pull, which side of the barrel the target will be, and to shoot sooner, yet more accurate. I also, made new friends. I would recommend camp to any shooter interested in improving their skeet shooting skills."

One of the highlights of the camp was youth athlete Lee Moulton achievement. "Besides being lots of fun the instructors at the skeet camp really helped me. As a result of their instruction, I was able to shoot my first 25 straight and then follow that with another 25 straight, for 50 straight targets! David Chipman was the perfect pick to be the ATF Director by the Biden Administration. His beliefs are EXACTLY the same as the Biden Administration and ALL the gun control groups. ## BIDEN’S ATF NOMINEE SUPPORTS EXTREME RIFLE BAN!

U.S.A. -(AmmoLand.com)- It was no secret President Joe Biden’s nominee to direct the Bureau of Alcohol, Tobacco, Firearms, and Explosives, David Chipman, supports a ban on commonly-owned semiautomatic firearms like the AR-15 and wants to force current “assault weapons” owners to register their firearms with the federal government through the National Firearms Act or forfeit their guns. After all, Chipman has worked as a paid gun control advocate for both Giffords (formerly Americans for Responsible Solutions and Legal Community Against Violence) and civilian

disarmament financier Michael Bloomberg’s Mayors Against Illegal Guns. However, an exchange during the anti-gun fanatic’s May 26 Senate confirmation hearing broke new ground for American anti-gun extremism by revealing the outrageous range of rifles Chipman would ban.

At the hearing, Sen. Tom Cotton (R-Ark.) asked the nominee, “Mr. Chipman you have called for an assault weapon ban. I have a simple question for you. What is an assault weapon?” After some evasion from Chipman, Sen. Cotton reiterated his question, which resulted in the following exchange.

Sen. Cotton: What is an assault weapon? How would you define it if you were the chair, the head of the ATF, how have you defined it over the last several years in your role as a gun control advocate?

Chipman: Senator, um if I’m confirmed as ATF director um you know my recollection is the only um process by which ATF has weighed in is I know there’s a demand letter three program which requires multiple reports, multiple sale reports on the southwestern border. ATF in that program has defined an assault rifle as any semi-automatic rifle capable of accepting a detachable magazine above the caliber of .22...

For decades, gun control advocates have endorsed a feature test to determine what firearms are to be defined as “assault weapons.” Under this rubric, a semi-automatic firearm must be capable of accepting a detachable magazine and be equipped with one or more prohibited features in order to qualify as an “assault weapon.” Under the 1994 Clinton “assault weapons” ban, these features included items such as a pistol grip, bayonet mount, and adjustable stock.

Chipman’s answer endorses a wildly broader definition of “assault weapon” that would include any semiautomatic rifle above .22 caliber capable of accepting a detachable magazine, regardless of the rifle’s configuration.

Noting the nominee’s shocking answer, Sen. Cotton remarked, “I’m amazed that might be the definition of assault weapon that would basically cover every single modern sporting rifle in America today.”

Chipman’s favored definition and gun ban is more extreme than that proposed by Sen. Dianne Feinstein (D-Calif.). Under her latest “assault weapons” bill, a semiautomatic rifle would fall under the ban if it has the capability to accept a detachable magazine and one item from of a list of enumerated features. Such features include a pistol grip, telescoping stock, threaded barrel, or barrel shroud. The nominee’s position is also more radical than the policies found in America’s most anti-gun jurisdictions.

Given his outrageous history of working to ban firearms and undermine the Second Amendment, any senator expecting the support of the gun-owning community must vote “no” on David Chip-

man's nomination to lead ATF.

## **GUN CONTROL HOWLS, GNASHES TEETH WHEN CALIFORNIA'S RIFLE BAN STRUCK**

U.S.A. -(AmmoLand.com)- Gun control supporters are howling. They're gnashing teeth with rage knowing that their "failed experiment" and labyrinth of lies came crashing down. Their gun grab is revealed for what it is - unconstitutional.

U.S. District Court Judge Roger Benitez struck down California's 30-year-old ban on Modern Sporting Rifles (MSRs) when he issued his ruling on Miller v. Bonta, a challenge against the state's law banning so-called "assault rifles." Judge Benitez cleanly took apart the law by asking simple questions. Does the law violate the Constitution? Does the law adhere to judicial precedent? Are AR-15s commonly owned?

On the Constitutionality question he wrote, "The Second Amendment protects modern weapons... They are principally AR-15 type rifles, pistols, and shotguns. Plaintiffs and others refer to them as "modern sporting rifles" although they are clearly useful for more than just sport."

On the question of judicial precedent, Judge Benitez examined it both under the landmark Heller decision, which held there is a pre-existing individual right to keep and bear arms in common use (that applies to the States) and the U.S. Court of Appeals for the Ninth Circuit's "two-step levels-of-scrutiny test."

"The overwhelming majority of citizens who own and keep the popular AR-15 rifle and its many variants do so for lawful purposes, including self-defense at home," Judge Benitez wrote. "Under Heller, that is all that is needed. Using the easy to understand Heller test, it is obvious that the California assault weapon ban is unconstitutional. Under the Heller test, judicial review can end right here."

Judge Benitez wrote that the Ninth Circuit's two-step test, unlike Heller, is anything but simple. The first step is determining if the law is presumptively lawful or a historical regulation. California's ban fails on both counts. The second step questions the scrutiny the prospective law would require and examines the burden it places on the Second Amendment. Since the Second Amendment clearly holds the right of self-defense in the highest regard, and California's ban criminalizes the ability to defend oneself in the home with an MSR, it fails the scrutiny test.

"When a severe restriction on the core right of self-defense amounts to a destruction of the Second Amendment right, it is unconstitutional under any level of scrutiny," Judge Benitez wrote.

The final question of whether MSRs are commonly-owned was asked and answered effectively.

"As applied to [Assault Weapons Control Act], the Heller test asks: is a modern rifle commonly owned by law-abiding citizens for a lawful purpose? For the AR-15 type rifle the answer is 'yes.'"

Judge Benitez noted that as of 2018, there were nearly 20 million MSRs in circulation. "There are probably more modern rifles in circulation than there are Ford F-150 pickup trucks," he wrote. "In 2018, 909,330 Ford F-150s were sold. Twice as many modern rifles were sold the same year. Imagine, every time one passes a new Ford pickup truck, it is a reminder that two new modern rifles have been purchased. That is a lot of modern rifles owned by Americans."

Igor Volsky, executive director of Guns Down America and vice president at the far-left think tank Center for American Progress, let loose with a rapid-fire tweetstorm. He started out calling the ruling

"infuriating," claiming a 30-round magazine can be fired off in less than five seconds (maybe by Jerry Miculek), somehow attempts to argue that just two rounds are used in self-defense, which Judge Benitez discredited, and ends with demands from liberal lawmakers on how they're going to write laws that survive Constitutional examination by the courts.

Short answer, Volsky, they won't and shouldn't.

Keith Olbermann, a sports commentator who went far-left on politics before getting drummed off even liberal networks, called Judge Benitez a "death-worshipping, fascist" on Twitter. Olbermann didn't account for the specific references Judge Benitez made to the inherent right of self-defense, which is life preservation, by definition.

Stanford University law professor and gun control advocate John Donahue, whose gun control testimony was discredited by Judge Benitez, told The Mercury News, "This has been a long-term effort on the part of the gun lobby, but until they got the fifth (conservative) justice, I thought it was largely going to be ineffectual. But now, we are at great peril."

He's right on one count. NSSF has been pushing a long-term effort to get the courts to apply the law according to the Constitution.

Giffords Law Center to Prevent Gun Violence called Judge Benitez an "extreme outlier." This is the same Giffords organization that still employs David Chipman, President Biden's nominee to head the Bureau of Alcohol, Tobacco, Firearms and Explosives (ATF). Chipman wants to ban "assault weapons" but couldn't define them when questioned at his recent confirmation hearing before the Senate Judiciary Committee.

Judge Benitez granted a stay in his decision to allow California's Democratic Attorney General Rob Bonta to appeal to the Ninth Circuit. Democratic Gov. Gavin Newsom's office called the decision a "slap in the face" and promised, "We're not backing down from this fight, and we'll continue pushing for common-sense gun laws that will save lives."

California has among the strictest gun control laws and prefers its citizens to remain unarmed and helpless when their lives are threatened. Judge Benitez noted that distinction in his decision when he compared California's litigation stance to views professed by Oakland's police chief that crime victims shouldn't arm themselves, but be willing victims who can testify against their attackers.

"Of course, a dead victim is a lousy witness," Judge Benitez noted.

Judge Benitez also outlined the importance of the courts defending the rights of the citizens against an overzealous government authority that would nullify rights in the name of public safety.

"In the end, the Bill of Rights is not a list of suggestions or guidelines for social balancing. The Bill of Rights prevents the tyranny of the majority from taking away the rights of a minority," Judge Benitez wrote. "When a state nibbles on Constitutional rights, who protects the minorities? The federal courts. The Second Amendment protects any law-abiding citizen's right to choose to be armed to defend himself, his family, and his home. At the same time, the Second Amendment protects a citizen's right to keep and bear arms to use should the militia be needed to fight against invaders, terrorists, and tyrants. The Second Amendment is about America's freedom: the freedom to protect oneself, family, home, and homeland. California's assault weapon ban disrespects that freedom."

This is how Judge Benitez makes gun control howl.
