2021 ORSA-NSCA SPORTING CLAYS CAMP



The Oak Ridge Sportsmen's Association in partnership with the National Sporting Clays Association, conducted its 3rd annual 2-day Youth Sporting Clays Camp, June 15-16 at the ORSA Sporting Clays facility, in Oak Ridge TN.

Fifteen youth athletes age 8-17 participated in the camp. Six certified NSCA instructors, Level I thru Level III, including 4 Level 1 ORSA members, instructed these youth athletes on proper stance, gun mount and advanced techniques to help them become better Sporting Clays shooters.

A gun fit and eye dominance test were done before the camp began to ensure the athletes had the proper gun fit, to make them more successful in Sporting Clays.

Safety always being the first priority of the camp, there were range safety officers assigned on the course, to provide a safe and fun environment. Safety briefings were held each morning before they headed to the course.

Bill Smith NSCA Level III Instructor and ORSA member commented, "this was our very best Sporting Clays Camp EVER! With our own members now Certified NSCA Instructors and the continued support from both ORSA and the NSCA, we were able to conduct the camp with very small groups of students with each NSCA Instructor.

Mike Bates the Head Instructor for the NSCA Youth Development was very pleased to see the level of development from the new Instructors since last year. Sporting Clays has come so far standing on the foundation laid by the ORSA Skeet and Trap programs. The final tribute was that Ray Faust was able to attend the Camp and assist me with my group. He laid the foundation for the Sporting Clays Course to be developed."

Mike also commented, "With the great success ORSA has had with their summer youth Sporting Clays camps, I don't understand why more clubs aren't taking advantage of the NSCA grant money available for these youth camps."

CIVILIAN MARKSMANSHIP PROGRAM (CMP) SERVICE RIFLE CLINIC SEPTEMBER 25, 2021, 8:00 AM – ORSA ED T. JOHNSON INDOOR RANGE FACILITY

The last clinic for 2021 will soon be held. We will meet at ORSA's Ed T. Johnson Indoor Range Facility on September 25th, 2021. Be on the lookout for next year's clinics to begin in March 2022.

The purpose of the clinic will be to introduce the basic marksmanship fundamentals to fire a Service Rifle (AR-15 or M1 Garand) accurately without the need for sandbags or a bipod, as well as introducing the other high-power rifle shooting disciplines and competitions held at the ORSA High Power Range.

ORSA will provide your choice of an AR-15 or M1 Garand, with ammo. With prior coordination, you may request to bring your own US Service Rifle (AR-15, M1-Garand, or M1-A and ammo) provided it meets current CMP rules. If you are permitted to bring your gear, cost is \$10.00. If you are using an ORSA rifle, ammo, and equipment; cost is \$40.00.

If you wish to participate, please read, and follow the instructions below.

- RSVP to David Kiefer orsaclinic@gmail.com, Answer the following questions:
- What is your name, email address, and age?
- Are you furnishing your own rifle and ammo? If you are, what are you bringing? (see safety)
- Or, Will you need a club AR-15(or M1)? (note, only club ammo may be fired in club rifles)
- Are you left-handed?
- You will then get a confirmation email which will have additional information.
- Once have received your conformation email you must notify us before Wednesday the 22nd if you cannot attend so others may take your spot. If you do not provide a cancelation notice, your participation in future clinics will not be guaranteed.

THE DAY OF THE CLASS:

- Schedule: Report to the ORSA Ed T. Johnson Indoor Range Facility at 8:00 AM Saturday.
- Firing will be complete by 4:00 PM.
- You will register, receive an introductory course of instruction and will be assigned a shooting relay and target number before being released to the high power range
- All firing (45 shots) will be conducted from the 200 Yard Line.
- Upon reporting to the firing line, you will be paired with a coach and fitted with a shooting jacket and glove.
- Upon reporting to the pits, you will learn target scoring procedures.

FEES (Cash or check made out to ORSA):

- \$40.00 for club rifle, ammo, and equipment
- \$10.00 if participant brings their own rifle, equipment and ammo

RANGE REQUIREMENTS, SAFETY, AND COMFORT:

- Space is limited.
- Eye and Ear Protection are required on all ORSA ranges and must be furnished by participants.
- Dress for the weather predicted, to include a hat and sunscreen. An inclement weather plan exists in the event of rain.
- No Muzzle Brakes, shooters and coaches are near each other on the firing line.
- Bring plenty to drink, and a light lunch.

As you know or may not know the concealed carry law in Tennessee is changed on July 2021. You no longer have to have a permit to carry concealed in Tennessee. We are offering a class on the new concealed carry law in Tennessee, which will be conducted by State Officials from Nashville. This class will be held at the ORSA club house on August 11 at ORSA from 6:00 PM to 9:00 PM. It is free there is no charge for this course. THE RIGHT TO KEEP AND BEAR ARMS

If you are conscious and an objective mind you cannot deny that the Second Amendment is under attack by the Biden Administration. "Attack" is not too strong a word if you just listen to their words. Biden has called for a total ban on all assault weapons. And what are "assault weapons" you ask? Any weapon they want to ban. They also want to ban high capacity magazines. Biden has also mentioned banning 9mm handguns.

The Biden Justice Department has asked the Supreme Court to allow law enforcement to enter your home and confiscate all your guns without a warrant. "Universal Background Checks" is another goal which will require gun registration.

And as Biden promised during the election, and has said so many times since, that he wants to hold weapons manufacturers legally liable if a firearm they produced is used in a crime. He knows this will put these manufacturers out of business thereby eliminating the supply of guns to American citizens.

Under pressure from the entire gun control crowd Biden has stated that he won't wait for Congress, he will use executive orders to neuter the Second Amendment. If Biden is successful in all these efforts you and I will become instant criminals.

TFA'S ANALYSIS OF GOVERNOR BILL LEE'S PERMITLESS CARRY LAW - AND WHY TO AVOID IT

The Tennessee Firearms Association recommends that people get or keep the Tennessee enhanced handgun permit rather than relying on the Governor's new permitless carry bill that goes into effect on July 1, 2021. For the full details underlying that advice, see today's TFA News post.

In sum, consider these points:

Governor Bill Lee's new law is not true constitutional carry. True constitutional carry means that everyone who can legally purchase or possess a firearm can carry the firearm in or on substantially all public properties. The Governor's law does not do this.

Governor Lee's law did not repeal the law that makes it a crime for an individual to carry a firearm with the intent to go armed. That could have been done but it is not what Governor Lee and the majority of the Republican controlled Legislature decided to do. Instead, they retained and perpetuated the prohibition that keeps individuals from carrying firearms in Tennessee for personal safety and non-criminal use.

Governor Lee's new law is a qualified exception to the criminal charge of carrying a handgun (not all firearms) with the intent to go armed. The law has at least 7 conditions that must be met in order to be eligible for the individual to rely on it.

Under Governor Lee's new law, there are numerous classes of individuals who can legally purchase and/or possess firearms including handguns who cannot take advantage of the new "permitless carry law"

There are geographic traps that were needlessly created by Governor Lee's permitless carry law. For example, while an individual who has a permit can carry in a public park or on a greenway it is a crime for an individual who is carrying under Governor Lee's permitless carry law to do so in a public park or on a public greenway.

Governor Lee's permitless carry law elevates at least one non-violent misdemeanor to a level that results in the infringement of a constitutionally protected right.

Significantly, there are a number of Republican legislators who have established on the legislative record that they also do not believe that this is true constitutional carry.

Some have asserted that this permitless carry law will "allow" some Tennesseans to carry a handgun without a permit. Yes, it does do that but it does it by creating a qualified exception to a criminal charge. That is not constitutional carry. That does not apply to all citizens equally.



Tennessee Firearms Association appreciates those legislators who worked to try and get real constitutional carry passed not only this year but even in the past. It is the goal but more significantly it is what "shall not be infringed" means.

TFA recommends to those who want to carry a firearm in Tennessee that they get the Tennessee enhanced handgun permit. That permit provides the broadest capacity to carry in Tennessee under current law, it provides the most options on how to carry in Tennessee, it provides defenses that are not available under the Governor's permitless carry law and it provides the greatest degree of acceptance under reciprocity standards with other states.

FEDERAL APPEALS COURT: GOV'T CAN'T BAN ADULTS UNDER 21 FROM BUYING HANDGUNS

Laws that prevent adults under the age of 21 from buying handguns at a gun shop are unconstitutional, a federal appeals court ruled Tuesday.

A three-judge panel for the U.S. Court of Appeals for the 4th Circuit ruled on the matter. Judge Julius Richardson, a Trump appointee, wrote the majority opinion for the court.

"Looking through this historical lens to the text and structure of the Constitution reveals that 18- to 20-year-olds have Second Amendment rights. Virtually every other constitutional right applies whatever the age. And the Second Amendment is no different," Richardson wrote.

"The militia laws in force at the time of ratification uniformly required those 18 and older to join the militia and bring their own arms. While some historical restrictions existed, none support finding that 18-year-olds lack rights under the Second Amendment," he continued.

Alan Gottlieb, the founder of the Second Amendment Foundation was more than pleased with the ruling.

"This is a great 2A victory. The written opinion is one of the best I have ever read," he told GunsAmerica via email.

Plaintiffs Natalia Marshall and Tanner Hirschfeld brought the case to court after the two Virginia attempted to purchase firearms but were denied because of their age.

"I've said the same thing repeatedly," Gottlieb acknowledged, "because it strikes at the very heart of gun control foolishness. We send young men and women into harm's way to defend our national interests, yet our laws arbitrarily say they shouldn't be trusted enough to buy a handgun here at home. That defies logic and common sense, and it's an insult to anyone in the affected age group who can vote for president, run for local office, start his or her own business, buy a home, enter into contracts or get married and start a family.

"We have similar cases pending in Illinois, Louisiana, Pennsylvania, Washington, California, Minnesota and other states that this Fourth Circuit ruling could directly impact," Gottlieb said. "The importance of common-sense decisions such as Judge Richardson's cannot be overstated."

NEW STUDY DELIVERS A KILL SHOT TO ANOTHER ANTI-GUN NARRATIVE

Well, we once again have new data that shreds the anti-gun Left and

their narrative about firearm-related violence during the COVID pandemic. Some nine million Americans became new gun owners. That's huge. Gun sales are through the roof. Once again, Joe Biden and the Democrats show they're expert gun salespersons. With the Biden administration aiming to tweak the ATF regulation of pistol stabilizing braces, you can bet the rush to stock up has only intensified. This rule would put 10-40 million Americans in legal jeopardy. There is no grandfather clause. All firearms targeted with this new regulation must either be registered or turned over. It's the largest gun confiscation and registration effort ever. It's the groundwork for the mass confiscation effort anti-Gun Democrat lust for, they're just waiting for expanded background checks to build a national database, but I digress.

New data shows that there is no relation to the spike in gun violence with the increase in gun sales (via The Guardian):

Gun homicides surged across the United States during the coronavirus pandemic, in the same year that Americans bought a record-breaking number of guns.

But some of America's leading gun violence researchers have concluded that what might seem like an obvious cause-and-effect – a surge in gun buying leads to a surge in gun violence – is not supported by the data.

Through July of last year, **there was no clear association between the increase in firearm purchases and the increase in most interpersonal gun violence at the state level**, according to a new study published in *Injury Epidemiology*, a peer-reviewed scientific journal.

The findings suggest that “we need to be looking at other factors, like job loss, economic change, the closure of schools and community organizations and nonprofits, and civil unrest,” in order to understand last year's increase in gun violence, Julia Schleimer, the lead author of the new study, said.

So, another anti-gun narrative got sniped. What else is new? Right now, gun owners are facing a new crisis which is readily available ammunition. It's quite possible that we won't see readily available 9mm or .223 Remington for at least 18 months. The increase in demand due to new owners, the Biden administration's anti-Second Amendment agenda, and the price of materials are all contributing factors.

PROTECTION OF LAWFUL COMMERCE. ARMS HAVE BEEN UNNECESSARILY SPECIFIED

By focusing the original bill exclusively on the arms industry, proponents made garnering support for it a bit easier within the gun-rights world – while at the same time focusing opposition.

USA – -(Ammoland.com)- The Protection of Lawful Commerce in Arms Act, or PLCAA, has been coming under more intensive fire since Joe Biden was declared President of the United States, and it's our own fault.

The PLCAA should just be the PLCA, the Protection of Lawful Commerce Act. The only reason the words “in Arms” were included, was specifically to make the bill a “gun bill,” to help motivate the troops and provide brownie points and bragging rights to politicians and lobbying organizations.

The introduction of the PLCAA was a legitimate response to the lawfare waged against the gun industry, but the legislation should have been much broader, encompassing all lawfully manufactured and sold products. By focusing the bill exclusively on the arms industry, proponents made garnering support for it a bit easier within the gun-rights world – while at the same time focusing opposition – and they avoided generating additional opposition from the powerful trial lawyers' lobby, which opposed the bill, but didn't put a lot of effort into their opposition.

They also painted a big, bright bullseye on the back of the law, and that's what the Biden administration is aiming at now.

The above points were argued by Neal Knox back in 2004 when the PLCAA was first introduced. He reasoned that a broader bill would be somewhat harder to sell, and would run up against some stronger opposition, but that it would also bring in additional allies, and result in better law in the end.

The core premise of the PLCAA is that a manufacturer or seller of a lawful product, which is not defective and was not marketed under false pretexts, should not, and indeed may not, be held responsible for the misuse of that product by a third-party actor.

This should be true, regardless of what the product is. In fact, in most of the lawsuits that have been brought seeking to hold a manufacturer or seller of a lawful product accountable for the actions of someone misusing their product, the courts have ended up throwing the suits out as “frivolous” or unreasonable. But “most” is not good enough, and in the case of firearms and ammunition, the suits were becoming more and more frequent, and were well-funded, often with taxpayer dollars. They weren't just occasional, random attempts by unscrupulous attorneys taking pot-shots at gun companies in hopes the companies would settle before the cases got tossed. The litigants acted with a clear and coordinated intent to bankrupt the firearms industry, not necessarily through winning, but by forcing the industry to defend itself. Repeatedly.

In any civil litigation, there's a calculation that has to be made, weighing the cost of the litigation against the cost of settling early. Often the settlement costs are substantially lower than the litigation costs, even if the case is eventually tossed by the judge.

What the PLCAA effectively does is create a pretrial reality check, requiring the judge to look at the case right at the outset and determine whether there is a reasonable claim, or whether it is a case of someone trying to hold an innocent party responsible for the actions of an unrelated guilty party.

This should be standard procedure in all civil litigation. No individual, group, or government entity should be able to weaponize the courts as a way of beating down a person, business, or industry.

Along with the protections of judicial review up-front, before a whole lot of money has been spent on attorneys and the restitution of those attorney fees if the case gets tossed, there should also be protections on the backside of civil litigation, in the form of restitution of legal fees for the prevailing party. That's something the trial lawyers' lobby has opposed for decades because it would cause many of their clients to hesitate before going forward with frivolous and abusive litigation.

The most prevalent talking point from opponents of the PLCAA, As we just heard again from Governor Cuomo in New York, is that the gun industry is the only industry in the US that enjoys protection from civil suits. While that's not really true, the perception of imbalance is unacceptable, so it's time to protect all lawful businesses from predatory legal assaults. While we continue to defend the PLCAA, The Firearms Coalition is proposing that members of Congress start working on the Protection of Lawful Commerce Act, shielding all lawful businesses from abusive lawfare attacks based on the actions of unrelated third parties. The PLCA would provide restitution of legal fees to victims of such abuse, both upfront, and on the backside of these attacks if they are allowed to proceed.

We might not have the votes to pass it until 2023, after the next congressional election, but let's get it started right now.

You can help. Send a letter to your friendly Representative and Senators, urging them to support the Protection of Lawful Commerce Act. Include a copy of this article or a link to it, so they can see how and why it makes sense.

You are the Gun Lobby. Use your influence to get solid pro-rights legislation introduced and passed, even if it doesn't mention guns.
