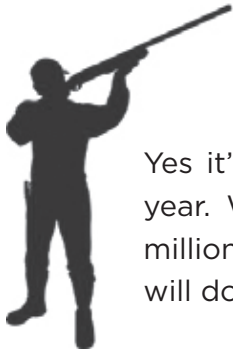

MAY A POLICE OFFICER STOP AN INDIVIDUAL WHO IS CARRYING A HANDGUN IN TENNESSEE?

Tennessee now has the potential for millions of adults to carry a handgun in Tennessee with or without a permit. That environment gives rise to a significant question in Tennessee which is – if a law enforcement officer sees an individual carrying a handgun in public is that sufficient to allow the officer to make an investigatory stop of the individual? The answer to this question requires a careful consideration of Tennessee law.

The first step in the analysis likely requires that we determine what the elements of a crime of carrying a firearm are under Tennessee law and then look at what the defenses or exceptions to the crime may be. Why? The state is responsible for proving the elements of a crime and that is all that it must prove. The individual is at least initially responsible for proving that his or her conduct falls within one of the defenses or exceptions. The primary consideration for whether the officer has the right to stop the individual likely turns only on the issue of what are the elements of the crime – not on the existence of possible defenses or exceptions.

It is a crime in Tennessee for an individual to carry a firearm with the intent to go armed. There are only two fundamental elements to the crime. Was the individual carrying a firearm? Second, did the individual have the intent to go armed? Both of these elements are found in Tennessee Code Annotated § 39-17-1307(a)(1) which states:

(a)(1) A person commits an offense who carries, with the intent to go armed, a firearm or a club.

Unlike many other states Tennessee law is written so that any individual who carries a firearm with the intent to go armed commits a crime. Other states have laws written so that it is not a crime to openly carry a firearm or which may make it a crime to carry a concealed weapon without a permit or, like Vermont, where it is simply not a crime for a citizen to carry a firearm openly or concealed.

Instead of defining the conduct as “not a crime”, the Tennessee Legislature has instead chosen to create a number of “defenses”, such as in Tennessee Code Annotated § 39-17-

1308, or “exceptions”, such as in Tennessee Code Annotated §§ 39-17-1307(e) or -1307(g), to a crime. At present, Tennessee does not have an environment where carry a firearm in public with intent to go armed – independent of any other facts, conditions or qualifications – is simply not a crime.

Under Tennessee law the existence of a “defense” or an “exception” is not something that the state must deal with in order to investigate a potential crime, in its decision to bring charges or even in its case in chief at trial. Generally, the defense or exception must be raised by the defendant and only then does the state have the burden to disprove its application at trial.

Therefore, because of the way that Tennessee’s statutes are written, an officer who observes someone carrying a firearm in public in a manner which indicates an intent to go armed (such as carrying it holstered) could easily demonstrate that there is probable cause to believe at that point that a crime has been committed. That may be all that is required to make an “investigatory” stop for the crime of carrying a firearm with the intent to go armed.

Tennessee law has changed numerous times since its modern handgun permit law was first written in 1994, but none of those rewrites have deleted the crime of carrying a firearm with intent to go armed. Further, it is not as if the Legislature does not know how to do that because during this same time frame it did delete the crime of carrying a knife with a blade greater than 4 inches. Instead, the Legislature has chosen a path where it has continued year after year to preserve the capacity of law enforcement to at least stop citizens who are carrying a firearm in public and it has placed the burden on the individuals to prove after they have been stopped that they fit into an exception or defense.

Some may be suggesting that an officer cannot in Tennessee perform a “Terry stop”, which is also known as a “stop and frisk”, when they observe an individual carrying a gun in public. However, it may be that such conclusions miss the point of the Supreme Court in its decision in *Terry v. Ohio*, 382 U.S. 1 (1968). The Court phrased the question before it as this “whether it is always unreasonable for a policeman to seize a person and subject him to a limited search for weap-

ons unless there is probable cause for an arrest.”

In Terry a law enforcement officer observed some individuals engaged in conduct which might be described as “casing” a specific business. No crime was observed but the conduct did make the officer concerned that a crime, a robbery, was about to occur. The officer approached the individuals, apparently identified himself and when the individuals did not offer identification the officer took custody of one of the individuals and began searching the individual in what was clearly a Fourth Amendment seizure. In the course of that search, the officer discovered a revolver. The Court was reviewing whether the officer’s actions were reasonable under the Fourth Amendment. One of the issues for the Court was whether the officer, under the facts and circumstances known to the officer at the time, acting reasonably in believing that a crime had been or was being committed by the detained individual and whether it was reasonable for the officer to make an investigatory stop. Under the facts of this case, the Court found that the initial investigatory stop was justified. The Court also considered, if there was a reasonable basis for an investigatory stop, whether there was also a reasonable basis to pat down or frisk the individual for weapons for the officer’s safety. The Court rejected the argument that a frisk was only appropriate incident to an arrest. Instead, it “conclude[d] that there must be a narrowly drawn authority to permit a reasonable search for weapons for the protection of the police officer, where he has reason to believe that he is dealing with an armed and dangerous individual, regardless of whether he has probable cause to arrest the individual for a crime.”

In Tennessee, the issue of whether an officer can perform the first type of stop discussed in Terry – the investigatory stop – is the analysis that is dependent on the state statutes regarding whether carrying a firearm in public is the exercise of a constitutionally protected right or whether it is merely a criminal act for which the individual may have one or more available defenses. If the conduct was the free exercise of a constitutional right, there would be no probable cause for an officer to believe a crime was committed by merely observing an individual carrying a firearm with the intent to go armed. But that is a law that the Governor and the Legislature have repeatedly refused to enact in Tennessee – a law that implements true constitutional carry.

Instead, Tennessee’s Legislature and Governor have chosen to make it a crime to carry a firearm in public and have set up a spectrum of defenses or exceptions, which are practically the same, that the individual must demonstrate to avoid or defeat the criminal charge. The observation of those facts by an officer is likely all that is required for an officer to make that initial investigatory stop. At that point, it is up to the officer and the individual to address the issue, if both desire to do so, of whether there is a valid and available defense or exception to the crime, whether the individual meets all the elements of the defense or exception and, consequently,

whether it would be a waste of time and effort for the officer to charge the individual with a crime only to have it later be dismissed when the defense is raised.

THE MASS ACT

You have to hand it to Senator Ed Markey (D-MA) and Representative Ayanna Pressley (D-MA), the title of the legislation they introduced in their respective bodies has two huge lies in just five words. When you look over what the Making America Safe and Secure Act of 2021, you will find it will provide neither safety nor security.

This legislation, with the bill numbers S 2325 and HR 4238 for the Senate and House version respectively, promises to bring safety and security by bribing states to implement gun licensing schemes. The fact is, licensing schemes don’t work. Maryland has passed a handgun licensing scheme, but Baltimore is still one of the cities with a high murder rate.

Furthermore, New York, despite its licensing scheme, had massive crime increases. What did get crime down? Well, they actually went after the criminals. All of the burdens and infringements they imposed on those who wished to exercise their Second Amendment rights didn’t work, either. Illinois has seen the same situation in Chicago.

But the fact is the two whoppers (with apologies to the delicious Burger King menu item) that this bill sells is not the worst part. When you check out the text of the legislation, you’ll see that one of the criteria for a state licensing scheme to qualify for one of those grants is “other factors relevant to the suitability of a license holder” with “suitable” person defined as someone who “does not create a risk to public safety.”

What does create a risk to public safety? Well, the proposed legislation does not say. That’s not all that is vague in this legislation. There’s a lot more room for some bureaucrat to deny a license through delay – since no timeframe for approval is in this legislation. This is how you get a tragedy like what happened to Carol Bowne in New Jersey. Not that her safety or security – or that of others facing real threats to their safety and security – matter to Markey and Pressley.

These sorts of schemes need to be stopped with the use of our First Amendment rights. Second Amendment supporters should contact their Senators and Representative to politely urge that they oppose S 2325 and HR 4238. They also should join a pro-Second Amendment organization and work to defeat anti-Second Amendment extremists at the

SUSAN RICE IS THE SECRET PUPPET-MASTER BEHIND BIDEN'S WAR ON GUNS

Biden's declining cognitive skills have become blatantly obvious – fodder for tweets and late-night comics. He cannot complete a simple sentence unless he's reading from a teleprompter. Biden drifts off mid-sentence and appears to lose touch with reality. It's happening far too often for comfort.

The President of the United States has become a puppet, who has to be led – sometimes by the hand – to waiting news cameras, where he stumbles through speeches that someone else has obviously written. So, who is pulling Biden's strings?

In my humble opinion, in the Biden-Harris Administration's war against our guns, former Obama national security advisor and UN Ambassador, Susan Rice, who now serves as Biden's domestic policy advisor, is clearly calling the shots. Rice has a staunch anti-gun pedigree, coupled with direct access to Biden – and Obama – and the means and ability to orchestrate the war against our God-given, constitutional rights.

The anti-gun forces love this woman. They were overjoyed when Biden appointed her as one of his closest advisors.

"Ambassador Susan Rice recognizes that gun violence is one of the most urgent threats facing our country, and through this appointment, President-elect Biden is continuing to build the strongest gun safety administration in history," John Feinblatt, president of Everytown for Gun Safety, said in a statement heralding her appointment. "As Ambassador Rice said in our Demanding Women conversation this summer, 'the American people want common-sense gun laws' – and we're excited to work with her to make that happen."

"Ambassador Rice is committed to ending our gun violence epidemic, and she understands that COVID-19 has dramatically exacerbated our gun violence crisis," Shannon Watts, leader of Moms Demand Action, said in the same statement. "Her appointment is proof positive that this administration is wasting no time in addressing the gun violence that takes 100 lives every day and wounds hundreds more. I know Ambassador Rice will be instrumental in helping tackle these dual public health crises."

Rice's anti-gun history is well documented.

In 2018, according to Everytown, then-Ambassador Rice signed a letter calling "gun violence" a national security threat. The letter called on officials to "ban assault weapons, mandate background checks and waiting periods, and raise the minimum age to purchase guns."

In 2020, when she was one of several vice-presidential contenders, Rice told a live Twitter audience that "In the Obama-Biden administration, we implemented more than

two dozen very important reforms that put curbs on access to guns, but we need legislation. We need Joe Biden in the White House and Democrats in control of the House and the Senate."

In February 2021, according to a statement from the White House press office, Rice held a virtual meeting with the leaders of Everytown, Moms Demand Action, Giffords and Brady. To be clear, she met with the entire anti-gun lobby personally, without her boss.

"They discussed the ongoing public health crisis of gun violence in America, the historic increase in homicides across American cities last year, and commonsense steps that can be taken to make our communities safer such as closing background check loopholes, stopping the proliferation of unregulated and untraceable 'ghost' guns, and expanding community-based violence intervention programs," the statement reads.

The country has seen powerful presidential advisors before, but it is highly unlikely that Rahm Emanuel, David Axelrod or Jared Kushner ever told their bosses what to do. They offered advice, not marching orders.

The difference with Rice's position is Biden's declining mental health. I have no doubt that not only does Rice tell Joe what to say, she tells him where to stand and what to wear when he's saying it. She has gone way past simply advising Biden, and has clearly taken personal charge of the war on our gun rights, and the role that her former boss, Barack Obama, plays in her decision making has yet to be fully revealed.

That Rice is unelected to any office yet wields so much personal power should scare every American, regardless of their political party, especially since she has a history of extremist views, which are out of step with mainstream Americans.

To be clear, Rice has opened the White House doors – which Biden is sometimes lucky just to find – to every anti-gun organization in the country, and has even allowed them to make major personnel decisions. How else do you think David Chipman was chosen to lead the ATF? Chipman was working for Giffords when Giffords met with Rice at the White House.

If you need further proof of Rice's power, she just colluded with eight Attorneys General on how to circumvent federal law in order to put lawful gun makers out of business. The AGs are sworn to uphold the law, not find workarounds to suit their personal beliefs, yet none of them were held accountable for the conspiracy.
