ORSA HIGHPOWER CLINICS ANNOUNCED FOR 2022

New for this year the Rifle & Pistol Club will be modifying how CMP Clinics are conducted. This is being done for several reasons. First, due to the large number of participants one additional clinic is being added. Secondly, clinics will be separated by skill level and use, and a basic clinic will be required before attending a highpower clinic. Finally, attendance will be an application process. We anticipate we can accommodate most folks for the basic clinics, but attendance to the higher-level clinics will be limited. Below is a description of each of the clinics we'll be hosting.

Basic Clinic: The basic clinic will teach fundamentals of marksmanship and safety. The intended audience is directed to those wanting to improve marksmanship skills and attendants will receive a certificate to purchase from the Civilian Marksmanship Program (CMP). One does not need prior experience with competitive shooting. There are no physical limitations. The clinic will use rimfire rifles and ammo and take place at the indoor range.

Highpower Clinic: The highpower clinic will build upon the basic clinic and provide additional skills needed to shoot in a CMP or NRA across the course (XTC) event at 200/300 and 600 yards, or CMP Games match. To attend a highpower clinic, the participant must have completed a basic clinic (above) within the last 12 months. The clinic will use club provided rifle and ammo. Individual rifles may be used, once it is verified it is NRA/CMP approved for matches. If you have attended a clinic in the past, this will essentially remain unchanged, except participation will be limited to allow more detailed time with the rifles and positions.

Advanced Highpower Clinic: To attend an advanced highpower clinic, the participant must have completed a highpower clinic (above), within the last 12 months. This clinic will consist of participating in a club across the course (XTC) match or CMP Games match as the advanced clinic. Attendees will be assigned a coach/mentor that will only be working with the attendee, (coach/mentor will not be shooting during the event), except for demonstration purposes. Attendees will have the option to use their rifle and gear, as long as it has been verified by ORSA staff to be satisfactory (NRA/CMP approved) for the match. We will not allow rifles that don't meet the NRA/CMP policies to be used in this match.

As a reminder, the purpose of these clinics is to teach fundamentals and to promote competition. Attendance in any, or all clinics, does not allow "access" to use the highpower competition range at their own discretion. The highpower range is designated for competition use and not as a general plinking range or to sight in rifles when the benchrest range is busy, or if one desires to sight in a rifle beyond 200 yds. Specific dates for each clinic are listed below. The details for the Basic Clinic are in this month's Rangefinder.

BASIC CLINIC: March 19, 2022 & August 27, 2022

HIGHPOWER CLINIC: April 16, 2022 & September 24, 2022

ADVANCED HIGHPOWER CLINIC: Tentatively scheduled for May 7, 2022 & October 1, 2022 (subject to change)

CIVILIAN MARKSMANSHIP PROGRAM (CMP) BASIC RIFLE CLINIC MARCH 19 & AUGUST 27, 2022, 8:00AM – ORSA ED T. JOHNSON INDOOR RANGE FACILITY

We will meet at ORSA's Ed T. Johnson Indoor Range Facility on March 19, 2022, and August 27, 2022. Attendance at a basic rifle clinic is required before attending a highpower rifle clinic, generally held the next month or later in the year.

The purpose of the clinic will be to introduce the basic marksmanship fundamentals, as well as introducing the other rifle shooting disciplines and competitions held at the ORSA High Power Range, and indoor ranges. Completion also enables qualified competitors to purchase rifles, ammo, and accessories authorized under the CMP Rifle Sales program (see thecmp.org for details).

ORSA will provide a bolt action 22LR rifle, with ammo. With prior coordination, you may request to bring your own 22LR rifle, typically a Ruger 10-22 is adequate. If you are permitted to bring your rifle and ammo, cost is \$10.00. If you are using an ORSA rifle, ammo, and equipment; cost is \$30.00.

If you wish to participate, please read, and follow the instructions below.

- RSVP to David Kiefer orsaclinic@gmail.com, Answer the following questions:
- What is your name, email address, and age?
- Are you furnishing your own rifle and ammo? If you are, what are you bringing?
- Or, Will you need a club rifle? (Only club ammo may be fired in club rifles)
- Are you left-handed?
- What are your goals for the clinic and marksmanship, and do you anticipate wanting to participate in the highpower clinic to shoot an M1 or AR Service rifle?
- You will then get a confirmation email which will have additional information.

Once you have received your conformation email you must notify us Wednesday before the clinic if you cannot attend so others may take your spot. If you do not provide a cancelation notice, your participation in future clinics will not be guaranteed.

THE DAY OF THE CLASS:

- Schedule: Report to the ORSA Ed T. Johnson Indoor Range Facility at 8:00 AM Saturday.
- Firing will be complete by 3:00 PM.
- You will register, receive an introductory course of instruction, and will be assigned a shooting relay and target.
- All firing (approximately 50 shots) will be conducted at the 50ft indoor range.
- Upon reporting to the firing line, you will be paired with a coach and fitted with a shooting jacket and glove.

FEES (Cash or check made out to ORSA):

- \$30.00 for club rifle, ammo, and equipment
- \$10.00 if participant brings their own rifle, equipment and ammo

RANGE REQUIREMENTS, SAFETY, AND COMFORT:

- Space is limited,
- Eye and Ear Protection are required on all ORSA ranges and must be furnished by participants.
- Dress comfortably to lay in prone or sitting position.
- Bring plenty to drink, and a light lunch.

I’ve made the point that the U.S. Constitution is under all-out assault. Freedom of speech is in danger of being eradicated. Social media and legacy media cancels any speech that goes against the official government narrative. Just like Joe Biden said above, the administration is calling on social media and media to cancel what the government deems is misinformation and disinformation.

Now, in what is the biggest power grab by the federal government, the Democrats in Congress and the Biden Administration is seeking to take over the whole election process.

The Constitution of the United States of America, Article I, Section 4:

“The Times, Places and Manner of holding Elections for Senators and Representatives, shall be prescribed in each State by the Legislature thereof; but the Congress may at any time by Law make or alter such Regulations, except as to the Places of chusing (sic) Senators.

For those who subscribe to this thinking, the only reliable path to victory lies in universal mail-in-ballots and removing all safeguards to ballot integrity, including identification requirements.

The formula also includes another pot of virtually unlimited money from Big Tech oligarchs like Mark Zuckerberg, who spent at least \$419 million in 2020.

In effect, the party has given up on broadening its appeal and settled on digging deeper into its base, and coupling that focus with letting Washington make the rules. Indeed, as Biden strangely confessed in a visit to the Capitol last week, his election-law push is *“not just whether or not people get to vote. Who counts the vote? That’s what this is about. That’s what makes this so different than anything else we’ve ever done.”* By putting the emphasis on controlling the vote-counting process, Dems are setting up an excuse if they lose this year’s midterms and laying the groundwork for calling the outcomes illegitimate.

Recall, too, that this is the same party that’s OK with requiring vaccine passports and photo identification to eat in a DC or New York restaurant, but believes any ID requirement for voting is racist.

So what does all this have to do with them Second Amendment? The Holy Grail for the Left is to get rid of the Second Amendment. Even with control of Congress and the White House the Democrats have been scared to directly attack to Second Amendment. But if they can change election laws where the federal government controls every aspect of the election process, they will have total power and control over the American citizen. With this power is there any doubt they will go after the Second Amendment?

BIDEN ADMINISTRATION ANNOUNCES NEW GUN STORAGE RULE

In response to a school shooting in Michigan last year, the Biden administration announced a new firearms rule, with the intention that all gun owners have secure places to keep their firearms.

The Department of Justice released a statement Monday with the new rule, which mandates all federally licensed gun retailers to certify that they have secure storage devices specifically compatible to guns they are selling on-site, according to theBlaze.

The DOJ stated that these devices “include a safe, gun safe, gun case, lock box, or other device that is designed to be or can be used to store a firearm and that is designed to be unlocked only by means of a key, a combination, or other similar means.”

TheBlaze adds that this new rule “amends and officially codifies” gun storage mandates already required by the Gun Control Act of 1999 for new Federal Firearms License applicants. The requirements will now be law for “any place where firearms are sold under the license to non-licensed individuals.”

Attorney General Merrick Garland said that the new policy is meant “to reduce the risk of firearms falling into the wrong hands,” and that “gun safety is a Department of Justice priority, and we will continue to take all appropriate steps to help reduce the number of people killed and injured by the misuse of firearms.”

The rule will go into effect in February.

WHAT RESOLUTIONS SHOULD SECOND AMENDMENT SUPPORTERS HAVE IN 2022?

The start of a new year is here, and as is the tradition, New Year’s resolutions will be made. While all too often, those resolutions are history by the end of January, Second Amendment supporters should be determined to keep their 2022 New Year’s resolutions. But what should they be?

REGISTER NEW VOTERS

Let’s face it, anti-Second Amendment extremists are registering eligible voters, so we need to make sure every eligible citizen who supports the Second Amendment is also registered to vote. If some shocking numbers are correct, this alone could be the difference between victory and defeat in the swing states that put an anti-Second Amendment extremist in the White House.

VET CANDIDATES

Just as important in the early part of 2022 is to vet the candidates for federal, state, and local office. The fact is, if you don’t want to be stuck with a disappointment like Larry Hogan or an enigma like Dr. Oz, you need to figure out who the best alternative to those candidates are – if they are in the field.

Ask the tough questions now but keep an open mind about the options. Remember, the first vote Susan Collins cast in the Senate after 2020 was against Chuck Schumer. If Schumer is the minority leader, he can’t do things like nuke the filibuster.

PASS LEGISLATION TO FIGHT FINANCIAL DEPLATFORMING

Yes, social media censors Second Amendment supporters. Yes, we have serious threats from Gavin Newsom and other inventive anti-Second Amendment extremists. But if the firearms industry or “gun promotion organizations” (read: pro-Second Amendment organizations and outlets like Ammoland) on a financial blacklist, the Second Amendment will be history. State versions of the Freedom Financing Act must be the top legislative priority of Second Amendment supporters.

MAKE THE CASE TO EVERYONE

If the 2021 election teaches Second Amendment supporters anything, they need to learn that the voters we don’t reach out to are the ones we will not have a chance to win over. Like Susan Collins, Glenn Youngkin has shown Second Amendment supporters an important technique in how to win elections in hostile territory.

Given the political landscape in Virginia, Youngkin may not be at the level of Josh Hawley in defending the Second Amendment, but his techniques have much to commend themselves to Second Amendment supporters.

TURN OUT THE VOTES

Of course, all of the above will not matter if we do not get every pro-Second Amendment voter out to the polls. Know the laws governing elections and absentee ballots in your state and/or locality and get the vote out as aggressively as possible while staying within the law. Campaign like your First and Second Amendment rights are at stake... because they really are at stake.

Second Amendment supporters have a lot of work to do in 2022. The crucial task will be to defeat anti-Second Amendment extremists via the ballot box at the federal, state, and local levels this coming November. Then comes the task of replacing the Biden-Harris regime with a pro-

TENN. FIREARMS ASSOCIATION - TIME TO GET READY FOR THE 2022 LEGISLATIVE SESSION

It is the end of 2021 and the eve of 2022. 2022 will be a year that requires all of us to be ready to work to further remove the infringements under Tennessee law that continue to infringe the basic human rights and political rights that are protected by the 2nd Amendment.

TFA appreciates your prior support and needs your continued help. But, remember, a leader who fails to stand strong on the 2nd Amendment probably will not stand strong for any other conservative principle either!

We know that Governor Lee and the Republican controlled Legislature did not pass REAL constitutional carry in 2021 although many of them said they did. We know that they continue to leave laws on the books that create criminal traps (such as guns in parks) for Tennesseans who just want to be able to protect themselves and their families. We also learned in December that those Republicans in the Legislature have proposed to redraw a few legislative districts in what appears to be efforts to force some of the legislators who have been our strongest allies to have to run against other Republican incumbents in 2022!!!

Now is not a time to feel safe about the status of the 2nd Amendment in Tennessee!

First, if you are not a current member of the Tennessee Firearms Association please renew your membership in the Tennessee Firearms Association.

Second, we need you to spread the word about TFA to your family, friends, gun club bodies and "friends" on social media. Do not be hesitant to let them know what TFA is and that they should also be supporting it.

Third, annual membership fees do not cover what needs to be done. This year, for example, TFA spent approximately \$30,000 on billboards, radio advertising, social media and graphics design on one bill - the bill that should have

been passed as REAL constitutional carry but which the Legislature failed to amend to achieve that goal. Expenses like that are expected again in 2022 and we need your help by chipping in \$50, \$100, \$500, \$1000 or more to build the reserves we will need for similar campaigns in 2022 as well as the expenses we incur in election years like 2022. Please go to the TFA's member donations page and chip in now to show your support.

The battle in Tennessee to remove the state and local infringements on your 2nd Amendment rights is far from over. TFA members still have major legislative objectives including:

- 1) The passage of full constitutional carry that provides that anyone who can legally possess a firearm can carry it in almost all public properties and buildings. While the Governor and some legislators have been crowing about passing "constitutional carry" earlier this year - that is NOT WHAT HAPPENED. All they did was to pass a qualified defense to a criminal charge of carrying a firearm with intent to go armed. Real constitutional carry would require that the crime of "carrying with intent to go armed" be entirely repealed.
- 2) Strengthening standards that must be met before criminal charges can be brought in a self-defense matter as at least 7 other states currently do. We have already made a draft of this law and are calling it the "Kyle Rittenhouse law". We do not want any of you to go through what this young man did but current Tennessee law makes it very easy for you to also be a victim of political or unjust decisions to prosecute you if you are forced to defend your life like he was.
- 3) Allowing citizens the right to protect their home, property and business assets from rioters, thieves, looters and arsonists.
- 4) The repeal of all local regulation of firearms ownership and possession (including for example, the local bans on gun shows on locally owned exhibit halls).
- 5) Prohibiting the use of state resources to enforce federal firearms laws, rules, regulations and executive orders - which may be a huge issue with Joe Biden as president. Sure, Tennessee passed a law in 2021 that is called a "sanctuary state" law but as it is written it will do nothing - nothing at all to slow down Joe Biden or the ATF.
- 6) Protecting your right to attend gunshows despite local government agendas like those in Nashville.

Now is NOT a time to feel safe about the status of the 2nd Amendment in Tennessee!
