CAMP PERRY RIFLE MATCHES

ORSA Shooters sent a large contingent to Camp Perry again this year to compete in the National Rifle Matches. Various matches are held over a long week to include Service Rifle (AR-15) and a myriad of other vintage rifles, most notably the iconic M1 Garand.

Matches kicked off with several service rifle matches. A shot at making "The President's 100" alluded ORSA again this year. However, Robert Walker was the high ORSA team member at 144th place. We were pleased to see that "local" shooter Haley Robinson from outside of Asheville North Carolina earned a spot in the "Top 20 Shoot Off" again and earned 11th overall.

The next day, the National Trophy Individual Match saw Drew Rowe shoot the highest score among the ORSA Team. The 478-13X was enough for Drew to earn his Distinguished Rifleman's Badge. Other ORSA Shooters were close behind, but not close enough to earn Distinguished Rifleman Points.

Before team competitions began, ORSA team member Meredith Grant was invited to fire the cannon which proceeds the National Anthem each morning. Some may know that "ringing a bell" upon overcoming cancer is a tradition many patients do. It seemed only fitting that firing a cannon at Camp Perry was a fitting "ringing of the bell" for Meredith. All the ORSA Team and Meredith's husband, an Army Reserve Team shooter, were there to witness this celebration.

Next up was the 6-person team match, which requires much more than just 6 people to support. Team matches saw the ORSA Team place 8th of 38 out of competition teams, placing two spots and 30 points higher than last years placement. The improvement of two higher places and 30 points

does indicate the higher level at which the ORSA team now competes, as they've scored more points as a team than they have since at least mid-2000's competing at Camp Perry.

The Infantry Team Match the following day, we were able to field two teams (the Wind Dogs, and Wind Puppies). The Dogs were a bit disappointed as they did not earn as many points as last year but were still able to place 4th out of 29 teams. The Puppies finished the infantry Team Match 13th place, still a respectable showing.

With most of the shooting completed, the CMP games began the Friday afternoon of the last weekend. ORSA Shooters started strong with Kyle Kirschenmann and David Kiefer shooting the Modern Military Match with very competitive scores. David started off in first place with a strong 286-7X that would not hold up to the end of the weekend but finished 3rd Overall. While David's hopes faded as the weekend unfolded, Kyle consistently put up personal best scores and maintained consistency all weekend. Once the shooting was completed Kyle ended up 3rd place overall in the Three- and Four-Gun Aggregate scores for the weekend, a great accomplishment. We also saw great overall scores from frequent guest shooters to ORSA: David Graham frequently travels from Louisville Ky earned 8th in the Four Gun Aggregate, and 13th in the Three Gun Aggregate, and Jeff Watson from Chattanooga earned 12th in the Three Gun Aggregate.

A few ORSA shooters remained to shoot Vintage Sniper and compete in the long-range matches held at 800, 900, and 1,000 yards the following week.

Overall, a great time was had with minimal weather distractions.

AN APPEAL TO GET OUT AND VOTE THIS NOVEMBER

Everyone has an opinion about the actions or inactions of our governments: municipal councils; school boards; county commissions; the Legislature and Governor in Nashville; the federal government in Washington and its many unelected agencies spread across the country; and, for many of us, the governments in states we left behind. Sometimes our grievances or accolades are directed at the individual who represent us. Often, these opinions are expressed by friends, neighbors and strangers. Unlike people across the globe represented by parliamentary forms of government, we in America are represented by men and women whom we elect directly. They, in turn, form the government with which we come into contact daily, either directly or indirectly. Some academics and pundits alike argue that nearly every part of our lives is influenced by some law or regulation, some decades old.

In response to my query, the Rangefinder's Patrick Hackett tells me I have only three days to craft and submit a piece on getting out the vote. While good statistics require more research than I can commit at this time, a quick Google search revealed that in Tennessee, voter turnout in 2018, the off-year election, was 61% of registered Tennessee voters. In 2020, the TN Secretary of State's raw data reveals that number rose to 75%. So why is it that the August, 2022 primary vote attracted only 17% of registered voters? And does that number portend a similar turnout for the November 8 General Election?

There are a host of reasons why so few of us voted in August. After forty years in and around politics and campaigns, I've heard them all. But to candidates, numbers count! Here in my community, our Get Out the Vote Cam-

paign messaging included a purposefully unattributed quote by a serving official who said that county politicians don't listen to [my] community because they don't vote in municipal elections. A study of 2022 votes by District suggest that our voters may have made the difference in several races. But voter turnout was still only about 25% of my community's registered voters!

Numbers count; and candidates, whether they win or lose, scrutinize the numbers. Schools used to teach that, under America's democracy, we all have the right to vote; but inversely, we also have the duty to vote! Yes, many of us also write letters and emails to our representatives; but how many are truly read by our representatives versus some staffer instructed to keep a tally of opinions? How many of us receive letters in reply that seem to have no connection to why we wrote?

The deadline for registering to vote has already passed. Across Tennessee, absentee balloting is already underway, early voting will be available from October 19 to November 3; and there is always day-of voting. As a college freshman, I voted for George McGovern. Within a week of Nixon's election, I was wearing a button declaring, "If you didn't vote, don't B****." Voting has been made convenient and simple. Do some online candidate research. Take a cheat sheet into the voting booth. Vote for someone with whom you are not comfortable if you are mad at your party's candidate. Encourage your spouse, partner, eligible children, friends and neighbors to vote. But please, VOTE.

THE RIGHT TO KEEP AND BEAR ARMS

We know that we have mid-term election coming up in November. At stake is the control of Congress. The current Democrat House has passed several pieces of draconian gun control legislation but they have not been able to get the 60 votes needed in the Senate. But this has not stopped the Biden Administration from attacking the Second Amendment. Biden has used Executive Orders left and right to subvert the Second Amendment.

Biden and the media attacked the Supreme Court's (SC) *New York State Rifle & Pistol Association v. Bruen* decision. BIDEN ADDS TO LIST OF GUN LIES, THREATS IN GUN CONTROL PUSH

President Joe Biden is at it again. He's throwing out wild and unfounded lies to scare Americans into supporting his push for an unconstitutional ban on Modern Sporting Rifles (MSRs). If that's not outlandish enough, he continues to antagonize and threaten war against American citizens simply for exercising their Constitutionally-protected rights.

"Do you realize the bullet out of an AR-15 travels five times as rapidly as a bullet shot out of any other gun?" President Biden asked of the crowd in Wilkes-Barre, Pa.

Not true. First, President Biden fails to understand the difference between firearms and ammunition. The firearm, like an MSR, which comes chambered in many different calibers, doesn't determine the muzzle velocity of the projectile fired from the gun. MSRs are commonly chambered to fire 5.56mm/.223 caliber ammunition. Those rounds travel between 2,700-3,100 feet per second (fps), an easily-verifiable fact Fox News was able to uncover. Fox News and Breitbart both cited a Field & Stream report that examined bullet speeds of some of the fastest cartridges on the market used for hunting. Here's what they found:

- .220 Swift — A 40-Grain .220 Swift round moves approximately 4,300 fps.
- .257 Weatherby Magnum — An 87-Grain .257 Weatherby Magnum round moves approximately 3,700+ fps.
- .30/378 Weatherby — A 165-Grain .30/378 Weatherby round moves approximately 3,400+ fps.

- .224 Clark — An 80-Grain .224 Clark round moves approximately 3,500+ fps.
- .22 Eargesplitten Loudenboomer — A 50-Grain .22 Eargesplitten Loudenboomer round moves approximately 4,600 fps.

CANNONS & 9 MM

"You can't go out and buy a cannon," President Biden said in his Pennsylvania speech. It's a throwaway line for him and one that's patently false. He's previously added in that Americans couldn't buy cannons at the time the nation was founded.

Even The Washington Post gave him Four Pinocchios for that one, and no one looks to that news outlet to be a defender of gun rights.

That ranks up there with his previous claim that a 9 mm cartridge "will blow the lungs out of a body." Breitbart fact-checked that with a retired Navy SEAL, someone who might understand terminal performance of bullets on the human body. The answer: "No way." That was backed-up federal agent with 15 years of experience. That answer - "bullsh*t."

A 20-year federal agent told Breitbart it was "Not possible." A 21-year-veteran of a U.S. Marshal fugitive recovery taskforce revealed, "That's not even in the realm of possibility."

President Biden's firearms bona fides are looking, suspect.

DEER & CONSTITUTIONAL RIGHTS

"How many deer or bears are wearing Kevlar vests, huh?" President Biden asked deridingly. "Not a joke." The last time we checked, none..

"But we let any stranger — an 18-year-old — walk in — a 20-year-old — and buy an AR-15," President Biden also said.

That, of course, is just not true. Retail firearm purchases are only completed after an individual completes a Form 4473 and the retailer completes an FBI National Instant Criminal Background Check System (NICS) verification.

That statement also diminishes rights for adults fully-vested in their Constitutional rights. The president - who has sworn an oath to uphold and defend the Constitution of the United States - is claiming that only the rights he approves should apply. That's not how our Constitution works.

THREATS OF WAR

The president's antipathy toward Americans who exercise their Second Amendment rights didn't end there.

"If you want to fight against a country, you need an F-15," President Biden said. "You need something a little more than a gun. No, I'm not joking."

That statement was made after labeling those who remind the government the Second Amendment was written to prevent a tyrannical government from running roughshod over its citizens. For all the overheated rhetoric of media pundits frothing about a civil war, it seems strange that the president threatens the American public - about half of whom he called semi-fascist - with war.

It's not the first time, though. He made a similar statement in June 2021.

"If you wanted or if you think you need to have weapons to take on the government, you need F-15s and maybe some nuclear weapons," President Biden said in a White House speech.

Newsweek reported that the president's latest flippant F-15 remark was already viewed over 2 million times in less than 24 hours, drawing the ire of critics.

Fox News reported that Federalist senior legal correspondent Margo Cleveland tweeted, "So, 'Safer America' means, ...checks notes: A government threatening its citizens with F-15s."

The president's loose grasp of facts, willful ignorance of Constitu-



tional rights, veiled threats, and explicit insults are a recipe for failure. Instead of pledging to ban commonly-owned firearms, President Biden should be focused on locking up criminals instead of winking and nodding at progressive prosecutors releasing them onto America's streets. BIDEN DOUBLES DOWN ON THREAT TO 'BAN ASSAULT WEAPONS'

Joe Biden is doubling down on his threat to ban so-called "assault weapons"—a term even the Associated Press advises against using—and the key to getting this done, according to a weekend tweet, is to "elect more Democrats to the Senate and keep the House Democratic."

Biden was at a Democratic National Committee grassroots rally in Maryland, where he told the audience, "We just passed the first significant gun safety legislation in 30 years in this country. And I

promise you, we're not stopping here. I'm determined to ban assault weapons in this country."

However, according to a report in American Military News, when Biden led the effort in 1994 to pass a ten-year ban on semi-auto rifles and standard capacity magazines, the results were inconclusive as to whether the ten-year prohibition actually accomplished anything. The story referred to a 2004 report in the Washington Times, which had obtained a then-unreleased copy of a report by the Department of Justice National Institute of Justice. That report stated, "We cannot clearly credit the ban with any of the nation's recent drop in gun violence. And, indeed, there has been no discernible reduction in the lethality and injuriousness of gun violence."

And according to a 2021 report by FactCheck.org, "President Joe Biden claims the 10-year assault weapons ban that he helped shepherd through the Senate as part of the 1994 crime bill 'brought down these mass killings.' But the raw numbers, when adjusted for population and other factors, aren't so clear on that."

In Maryland, Biden pledged, "Will we be a nation of unity, of hope, of optimism, not a nation of violence, anger, hatred, and division."

Yet he immediately promised to make political war on essentially one-third of the population because they are gun owners. Millions of them own modern semi-auto rifles, which Biden has vowed to ban during his presidency. He has never backed away from that position, and he is making it clear if Democrats retain control of Capitol Hill, he intends to make that one of his legacy accomplishments.

If we elect more Democrats to the Senate and keep the House Democratic, imagine the possibilities. We'll codify Roe v. Wade, protecting a woman's right to choose. We'll ban assault weapons, saving countless lives. We'll protect voting rights. Let's get it done.

However, there may be political and judicial storm clouds on his horizon. In late June, a week after handing down the landmark ruling in New York State Rifle & Pistol Association v. Bruen, the Supreme Court granted certiorari (review) to four significant Second Amendment cases including a case from Maryland known as Dominic Bianchi et al. v. Brian E. Frosh et al., led by the Second Amendment Foundation and Citizens Committee for the Right to Keep and Bear Arms. The case challenges the Maryland ban on so-called "assault weapons."

The court vacated the original ruling by the U.S. Fourth Circuit Court of Appeals and remanded it back for reconsideration "with instructions that it apply the justices' broad interpretation of the Second Amendment right to keep and bear arms," according to the Maryland Daily Record. Because the Supreme Court granted certiorari, it's a certainty that if the case comes back, the court will hear arguments and then hand down an opinion whether such firearms are protected by the Second Amendment.

It would be impossible to ban a type of firearm protected by the Second Amendment.

In Maryland, Biden told his audience, "This November, we have to ask every candidate, 'are you for banning assault weapons or not?' and if you're not, we're not going to vote for you. Period."

Grassroots gun rights activists look at the issue differently. Candidates who do support a ban on semi-auto rifles are the ones to vote against in November. One good way to identify those individuals is whether they are identified as "gun sense candidates" by the various lobbying groups, as noted in GUNS Magazine.

Biden and other anti-gunners are pulling out all the stops.

The Federalist reports two new studies suggesting white people own guns and oppose gun control legislation because they are racists.

The political rhetoric is clearly ramping up in preparation for what is likely to be a bare-knuckles battle over control of Congress, which will be the only way to derail

Biden's gun control agenda. If Democrats are still in charge after November, Biden evidently figures there will be nothing stopping him.

PAYMENTS GIANTS TO APPLY NEW CODE IDENTIFYING SALES AT U.S. GUN STORES

Visa Inc, the world's largest payments processor, said on Saturday it will implement a new merchant category code for U.S. gun retailers, which will identify transactions at firearms stores.

The International Organization for Standardization (ISO) approved creation of the merchant code on Friday following pressure from gun-control activists who say it will help track suspicious weapons purchases.

"Following ISO's decision to establish a new merchant category code, Visa will proceed with next steps, while ensuring we protect all legal commerce on the Visa network in accordance with our long-standing rules," Visa said in a statement.

Mastercard Inc said on Friday that following ISO's approval, "we now turn our focus to how it will be implemented by merchants and their banks as we continue to support lawful purchases on our network while protecting the privacy and decisions of individual cardholders."

American Express Co said when ISO develops a new code, the company will work with third-party processors and partners on implementation.

The code will show where an individual spends money but not what items were purchased.

Several top U.S. pension funds including those for government workers in New York City and California had submitted shareholder resolutions asking payment companies to weigh in on the issue.

Some gun-rights activists have worried the new code could lead to unauthorized surveillance.
