SAFETY IS PARAMOUNT AED's: Where They Are and How to Use Them

AS you know safety is a priority for the Oak Ridge Sportsmen's Association at all Ranges and on the entire property. We want to be certain that all members know there are AED (Automated External Defibrillator) units as well as First Aid Kits in the Club House, Sporting Clays Office, Indoor Range, Action Pistol Office and anywhere else they are needed. Hopefully we won't have to use our emergency medical equipment. **Would you know what to do if someone you are shooting beside has a heart attack?** First call 911 and get emergency help on the way in the case of any serious injury. Because ORSA straddles two counties, make sure you are speaking with Anderson County and not Roane County. Their EMS is closer to ORSA. Ask to be transferred to Anderson County. If the individual is having symptoms consistent with a heart attack then get the AED unit and follow the simple voice instructions the machine will give when activated. **It would be the responsible action of all of us to use this link to watch a Red Cross video on using an AED:** <https://youtube/xs1mPMnxg> . It may save a life at ORSA or any of the millions of places where an AED is located. I hope the shooter next to me took a few minutes to save me in an emergency.

Civilian Marksmanship Program (CMP) Highpower Rifle Clinic and CMP Games Match

April 22 & September 23, 2023, 8:00 AM - ORSA Ed T. Johnson Indoor Range Facility

We will meet at ORSA's Ed T. Johnson Indoor Range Facility on April 22, 2022, and September 23, 2023. Attendance at a basic rifle clinic is required before attending a highpower rifle clinic, or prior marksman-ship training and evidence of prior competitive ex-perience. The purpose of the clinic is to refine ba-sic marksmanship fundamentals learned in the basic clinic, particularly the use of the sling. New for 2023 ORSA will host an OPTIONAL CMP Games Match im-mediately afterwards.

ORSA will provide your choice of an AR-15 or M1 Garand, with ammo. With prior coordination, you may request to bring your own US Service Rifle (AR-15, M1-Garand, or M-1A and ammo) provided it meets current CMP rules. If you are permitted to bring your gear, cost is \$10.00. If you are using an ORSA rifle, ammo, and equipment; cost is \$40.00 for use of AR, \$60 for the use of M1 Garand.

If you wish to participate, please read, and follow the instructions below:

RSVP to David Kiefer orsaclinic@gmail.com, Answer the following questions:

- What is your name, email address, and age?
- Are you furnishing your own rifle and ammo? If you are, provide details to ensure CMP compliance. (just google CMP Highpower Rules)
- Or, Will you need a club AR-15(or M1)? (note, only club ammo may be fired in club rifles)
- Are you left-handed?
- Do you plan to attend the optional CMP Games Match Afterwards?
- You will then get a confirmation email which will have additional information.

Once you have received your confirmation email you must notify us before Wednesday before the clinic if you cannot attend so others may take your spot. If you do not provide a cancelation notice, your par-ticipation in future clinics will not be guaranteed.

The Day of the Class:

- Schedule: Report to the ORSA Ed T. Johnson In-door Range Facility at 8:00 AM Saturday.
- Firing will be complete by 4:00 PM.
- You will register, receive an introductory course of instruction and will be assigned a shooting relay and target number before being released to the high power range
- All firing will be conducted from the 200 Yard Line.
- Upon reporting to the firing line, you will be paired with a coach and fitted with a shooting jacket and glove.
- Upon reporting to the pits, you will learn target scoring procedures.

Fees (Cash or check made out to ORSA):

- \$40.00 (\$60 for M1) for club rifle, ammo, and equipment
- \$10.00 if participant brings their own rifle, equipment and ammo

Range Requirements, Safety, and Comfort:

- Space is limited,
- Eye and Ear Protection are required on all ORSA ranges and must be furnished by participants.
- Dress for the weather predicted, to include a hat and sunscreen. An inclement weather plan exists in the event of rain.
- **No Muzzle Brakes**, shooters and coaches are near each other on the firing line.
- **Bring plenty to drink, and a light lunch.**

Well here we are. America is a blessed place to live. Our country was founded over 246 years ago. It was founded to create a country based on individual freedom and liberty. "We the people" would be our watchword where the people would be in charge and the governments we formed, local, state and federal, would be empowered to PROTECT the god given freedoms and liberties that are innate. Our Founding Fathers created a constitutional, democratic republic that only gave the federal government limited (enumerated) powers. The Constitution was unique in the history of the world. Despite the passage of time, American's still enjoy freedom and liberty above every other citizen of the world.

Well now we have a federal government that is 3.8 million strong. Almost every legislative act passed by Congress grows this same federal leviathan. We still elect our representatives to Congress and every four years elect a president. Does it matter anymore?

A few years ago I ran across the following essay that is well worth your time to read and ponder. I think it is time for each of us to ask: are we sheep, wolves, or sheepdogs? Here is the essay in part:

Of Sheep, Wolves and Sheepdogs

In May 2013 Brett and Kate McKay posted a series of articles "Are You a Sheep or Sheepdog?" In it they said "Last year I took a handgun class at the U.S. Shooting Academy here in Tulsa. During one of our breaks, our burly, mustached instructor shared an insight from retired Army Lt. Col. and author Dave Grossman that's given me a lot of food for thought this past year. According to Grossman, the human population can be divided into three groups: sheep, wolves, and sheepdogs."

Sheep

"Most people are sheep. Grossman isn't using the term pejoratively; he's simply referring to the fact that most human beings are kind, gentle, and peaceful. The conflicts and ethical dilemmas they're regularly faced with rarely rise to the level of life and death, good versus evil. For the most part people deal with challenges that are more annoyances than true crises. And when faced with conflict, they generally try to do the right thing, avoid making waves, and demonstrate pro-social behavior.

"While most people are kind and good, they simply

don't know how to deal with evil and dangerous people because for the most part they don't encounter and interact with evil and dangerous people in their day-to-day lives. Like sheep, they largely move about with those who are like them and do as others do. They are content to subsist in a predictable and routine sphere. As they live and graze, they cannot envision anything disrupting their peace or routine, and imagine that each day will proceed like the last. And just like sheep, most people depend on somebody else to protect and take care of them and keep this relatively placid world around them going smoothly, be it the police, military, or some administrative agency."

Wolves

"Wolves are bad guys. They exist in the shadows outside the porous perimeter of safety that surrounds the sheep. Wolves are the sociopaths who commit violent crimes or ignore moral or ethical boundaries with impunity. They take advantage of the sheep's tendency to be inexperienced with evil, unprepared for attack, and caught flat-footed when a crisis arises. This allows these evil men to, as Grossman puts it, "feed on the [sheep] without mercy." According to Grossman, a minutely small percentage of the population can be described as true "wolves." He puts the number at around 1%."

Sheepdogs

"Sheepdogs are society's protectors. Grossman himself doesn't flesh this out (or the other categories) all that deeply, but in reading up on the role of "livestock guardian dogs," I found an uncannily good description of human sheepdogs."

"While both herding dogs and livestock guardian dogs (LGDs) are known as sheepdogs, their roles are quite different. The former bark at, nip, and stare down animals to keep them together and moving in a certain way. Livestock guardian dogs, on the other hand, live with their flock of animals full-time, allowing them to blend in and watch for intruders within the herd. LGDs are placed in the flock as puppies so that they "imprint" on the animals they will be tasked with caring for and protecting. Strongly bonded to them, the LGD will perceive other species as predators and protect those it knows from these potentially hostile outsiders."

"Large and protective, the mere presence of a LGD in a herd can deter would-be predators, and those that dare to venture closer often turn tail when the dog



simply demonstrates its aggression through barking and intimidation. According to Wikipedia: "LGDs seldom kill predators; instead, their aggressive behaviors tend to condition predators to seek unguarded (thus, non-farm animal) prey. For instance, in Italy's Gran Sasso National Park, where LGDs and wolves have coexisted for centuries, older, more experienced wolves seem to 'know' the LGDs and leave their flocks alone."

"If a predator is not dissuaded by the presence of a LGD, it is ready and willing to attack and fight the predator to the death. And the LGD does not simply wait for a predator to attempt to infiltrate the flock - it also actively patrols its territory, seeking out predators and even luring them in to hunt them. Yet despite their fierceness, LGDs make loyal, gentle companions, and are especially protective of children."

"According to Wikipedia, "The three qualities most sought after in LGDs are trustworthiness, attentiveness, and protectiveness—trustworthy in that they do not roam off and are not aggressive with the livestock, attentive in that they are situationally aware of threats by predators, and protective in that they will attempt to drive off predators."

"The role of human "sheepdogs" is almost exactly that of their canine counterparts. Like actual sheepdogs, they live among the flock - one of them, and yet different and set apart. They protect the perimeter and vigilantly watch for evil "wolves." Their mere presence can keep bad men turning on each other instead of on law-abiding citizens, but if they do attack, human sheepdogs are alert and ready to be aggressive. They are prepared to make a stand against those who would do others harm, but outside of times of crisis, they are gentle and trustworthy. Grossman describes human sheepdogs as individuals who have a capacity for violence but also a moral compass and a "deep love for [their] fellow citizens." Their hardihood and bravery gives them the ability to "walk into the heart of darkness, into the universal human phobia, and walk out unscathed."

"Sheep find sheepdogs annoying when things are fine. For example, most people grumble about the police when they get a ticket for a minor traffic violation. But when a wolf shows up, and the police catch him, the complaining stops and people turn out to line the streets, cheer them on, and

shower them with gratitude. As with wolves, sheepdogs make up a very small percentage of the population. Grossman guesses this elite group represents just 1% of people."

The Sheep/Sheepdog Continuum

"Grossman argues that "the business of being a sheep or sheepdog is not a yes-no dichotomy." Rather it's a continuum. Some folks live at the extreme ends of the spectrum and are completely passive sheep or hardened ultimate warriors. Most people, however, fall somewhere in between."

"Your "sheepness" or "sheepdogness" can change depending on context, too. I've known men who act like fierce sheepdogs in one situation, but have the passivity of lambs in another."

I thought a lot about what is going on in our country for the last few decades and the last eight years in particular. Like a lot of conservatives I believe in the U.S. Constitution and the tenets espoused in the Declaration of Independence. I'm troubled that the rights, freedoms and liberties that are "guaranteed by those two documents have been slowly vanishing. As I have been pondering "what went wrong" and "how can this be fixed" this paradigm of sheep, wolves, and sheepdogs has come to mind - but in a different context than Dave Grossman envisioned and what Brett and Kate McKay wrote about.

In this line of thought I think, like Grossman, that most Americans are sheep. But in the context of my concerns in the preceding paragraph I believe that the wolves are the government. Continuing with this line of thinking the sheepdogs are conservative patriots who are working to stem the tide of government encroachment into our lives, government abuse of individual liberties, and government usurpation of our individual liberty and freedom.
