## Civilian Marksmanship Program (CMP) Highpower Rifle Clinic and CMP Games Match

**April 22 & September 23, 2023, 8:00 AM - ORSA Ed T. Johnson Indoor Range Facility**

We will meet at ORSA's Ed T. Johnson Indoor Range Facility on April 22, 2023, and September 23, 2023. Attendance at a basic rifle clinic is required before attending a highpower rifle clinic, or prior marksmanship training and evidence of prior competitive experience. The purpose of the clinic is to refine basic marksmanship fundamentals learned in the basic clinic, particularly the use of the sling. New for 2023 ORSA will host an OPTIONAL CMP Games Match immediately afterwards.

ORSA will provide your choice of an AR-15 or M1 Garand, with ammo. With prior coordination, you may request to bring your own US Service Rifle (AR-15, M1-Garand, or M-1A and ammo) provided it meets current CMP rules. If you are permitted to bring your gear, cost is \$10.00. If you are using an ORSA rifle, ammo, and equipment; cost is \$40.00 for use of AR, \$60 for the use of M1 Garand.

**If you wish to participate, please read, and follow the instructions below.**

RSVP to David Kiefer [orsaclinic@gmail.com](mailto:orsaclinic@gmail.com), Answer the following questions:

- What is your name, email address, and age?
- Are you furnishing your own rifle and ammo? If you are, provide details to ensure CMP compliance. (just google CMP Highpower Rules)
- Or, Will you need a club AR-15(or M1)? (note, only club ammo may be fired in club rifles)
- Are you left-handed?
- Do you plan to attend the optional CMP Games Match Afterwards?
- You will then get a confirmation email which will have additional information.

Once you have received your confirmation email you must notify us before Wednesday before the clinic if you cannot attend so others may take your spot. If you do not provide a cancelation notice, your participation in future clinics will not be guaranteed.

### **The Day of the Class:**

- Schedule: Report to the ORSA Ed T. Johnson Indoor Range Facility at 8:00 AM Saturday.
- Firing will be complete by 4:00 PM.
- You will register, receive an introductory course of instruction and will be assigned a shooting relay and target number before being released to the high power range
- All firing will be conducted from the 200 Yard Line.
- Upon reporting to the firing line, you will be paired with a coach and fitted with a shooting jacket and glove.
- Upon reporting to the pits, you will learn target scoring procedures.

### **Fees (Cash or check made out to ORSA):**

- \$40.00 (\$60 for M1) for club rifle, ammo, and equipment
- \$10.00 if participant brings their own rifle, equipment and ammo

### **Range Requirements, Safety, and Comfort:**

- Space is limited,
- Eye and Ear Protection are required on all ORSA ranges and must be furnished by participants.
- Dress for the weather predicted, to include a hat and sunscreen. An inclement weather plan exists in the event of rain.
- **No Muzzle Brakes**, shooters and coaches are near each other on the firing line.
- **Bring plenty to drink, and a light lunch.**

## **The Footnote to End All Gun Control**

The United States of America is founded on the presumption of innocence. After the Supreme Court's landmark New York State Pistol Rifle Association v. Bruen Supreme Court decision, there is now a presumption that gun laws are unconstitutional unless the government can prove there was a similar law at the time of the ratification of the Second Amendment.

According to the Bruen decision, the interest balancing test does not apply to Second Amendment cases. The courts can only rely on the original text, history, and tradition of the Second Amendment.

This decision put most anti-gun politicians and advocates in a precarious position. Almost no gun control existed at the time of the Second Amendment's ratification. With the combination of little to no supporting historical evidence and without leniency from the previous interest balancing test, gun control advocates will have a much harder time of successfully passing legislation that will defeat SCOTUS's new test. The anti-gun side had to find something in history that would save gun control laws.

Anti-gun state and gun control advocates usually point to the Sir John Knight's Case that challenged the Statute of Northampton. According to the anti-gun side, the law forbids carrying a firearm in public. Still, most legal scholars agree that it banned the carrying of a gun in public only if the intent is to terrify the people. Without many other examples of gun control laws, the anti-gun side must base their arguments on this case.

Unfortunately for the gun control side, the Supreme Court addressed the Sir John Knight's Case and others like it. According to Footnote 11 of the Bruen decision, whenever multiple interpretations can be taken from a case, the Supreme Court will favor the interpretation that favors the Second Amendment. This demand puts the burden on the state to prove their analog is consistent with the original text, history, and tradition of the Second Amendment.

Footnote 11 reads: "The dissent discounts Sir John Knight's Case, 3 Mod. 117, 87 Eng. Rep. 75, because it only "arguably" supports the view that an evil-intent requirement attached to the Statute of Northampton by the late 1600s and early 1700s. See post, at 37. But again, because the Second Amendment's bare text covers petitioners' public carry, the respondents here shoulder the burden of demonstrating that New York's proper-cause requirement is consistent with the Second Amendment's text and historical scope. See supra, at 15. To the extent there are multiple plausible interpretations of Sir John Knight's Case, we will favor the one that is more consistent with the Second Amendment's command."



Because SCOTUS referenced the case in a footnote doesn't mean the state will not try to use Sir John Knight's Case. We have seen states argue that they can use laws from the ratification date of the Fourteenth Amendment to defend their anti-gun statutes. The Fourteenth Amendment was ratified shortly after the Civil War ended when states passed laws to prevent formerly enslaved people from getting firearms. Some courts might even accept these arguments, but it is delaying the inevitable.

SCOTUS laid down a straightforward test for gun laws. If a law is inconsistent with the plain text, history, and tradition of the Second Amendment, it must be thrown out. This new test puts the burden on the states to prove that their law is compatible with the Second Amendment.

### **"Well-regulated" does not mean regulated by government.**

The Second Amendment provides that "A well-regulated Militia, being necessary to the security of a free State, the right of the people to keep and bear Arms, shall not be infringed." The phrase has a specific purpose. That purpose is not to authorize government entities to enact laws or regulations that limit who could own arms, what kind of arms they could own, or what they lawfully did with those arms.

Unfortunately, too many people, including too many serving in government, operate under the delusion that the language of the Second Amendment authorizes government "regulation" of firearms. These gun control advocates, or "big government" advocates urge many to operate under the delusion that the Second Amendment only protects "sporting arms" or "self-defense firearms".

The purpose of the phrase "well-regulate" was to underscore that the right protected by the Second Amendment included the political right of the citizens to have arms (not just firearms) and accessories suitable for the people to rise up and displace any existing or future government. Because the Second Amendment protects a political right, its purpose is not limited to self-defense, hunting or recreational shooting. The Second Amendment, stating that a well regulated (equipped and trained) militia (the citizenry) is necessary to the security of a free state, was specifically understood and intended to protect civilian ownership of military grade firearms.

In 1840, the Tennessee Supreme Court held in *Aymette v. State*, 21 Tenn. 154 (1840), that

"the arms the right to keep which is secured are such as are usually employed in civilized warfare, and that constitute the ordinary military equipment. If the citizens have these arms in their hands, they are prepared in the best possible manner to repel any encroachments upon their rights by those in authority."

In 1939, the United States Department of Justice submitted a brief to the United States Supreme Court in the proceedings of *United States v. Miller*, in which the Department of Justice stated the following concerning the nature of arms that are protected by the Second Amendment from government infringement:

"While some courts have said that the right to bear arms includes the right of the individual to have them for the protection of his person and property as well as the right of the people to bear them collectively (*People v. Brown*, 253 Mich. 537; *State v. Duke*, 42 Tex. 455), the cases are unanimous in holding that the term "arms" as used in constitutional provisions refers only to those weapons which are ordinarily used for military or public defense purposes and does not relate to those weapons which are commonly used by criminals."

But the advocates of gun control focus on the phrase "well-regulated" and exhibit their civics ignorance by completely misconstruing the phrase.

Their assertion that "well-regulated" grants authority to government to regulate civilian gun ownership was flatly rejected by the United States Supreme Court in 2008 in its *Heller* decision. In *Heller*, the Court explained that the phrase "well-regulated" described the necessity of a well armed, well prepared and well trained citizenry:

Finally, the adjective "well-regulated" implies nothing more than the imposition of proper discipline and training. See *Johnson* 1619 ("Regulate": "To adjust by rule or method"); *Rawle* 121-122; cf. *Va. Declaration of Rights* §13 (1776), in 7 *Thorpe* 3812, 3814 (referring to "a well-regulated militia, composed of the body of the people, trained to arms").

Thus, in complete contrast to the misconstrued use of the phrase would suggest, the actual meaning of the phrase has more to do with promoting the purchase, ownership, use and expertise with and of firearms – including military suitable firearms – by all civilians. That preparedness and expertise was the basis on which the 13 states were able to separate from English rule and establish a new nation and it is that necessary threat to government tyranny that assures the "security of a free state."

It is critical that 2nd Amendment advocates, advocates for constitutional rights, "let them feel the heat" as President Reagan taught. When Tennessee's Legislature calls for a Red Flag law, a clearly unconstitutional proposal, it is time to make our Legislators or members of Bill Lee's administration "feel the heat".
