## **Civilian Marksmanship Program (CMP) Highpower Rifle Clinic and CMP Games Match on September 23, 2023, 8:00 AM – ORSA Ed T. Johnson Indoor Range Facility**

We will meet at ORSA's Ed T. Johnson Indoor Range Facility on September 23, 2023. Attendance at a basic rifle clinic is required before attending a highpower rifle clinic, or prior marksmanship training and evidence of prior competitive experience. The purpose of the clinic is to refine basic marksmanship fundamentals learned in the basic clinic, particularly the use of the sling. New for 2023 ORSA will host an OPTIONAL CMP Games Match immediately afterwards.

ORSA will provide your choice of an AR-15 or M1 Garand, with ammo. With prior coordination, you may request to bring your own US Service Rifle (AR-15, M1-Garand, or M-1A and ammo) provided it meets current CMP rules. If you are permitted to bring your gear, cost is \$10.00. If you are using an ORSA rifle, ammo, and equipment; cost is \$40.00 for use of AR, \$60 for the use of M1 Garand.

**If you wish to participate, please read, and follow the instructions below.**

RSVP to David Kiefer [orsaclinic@gmail.com](mailto:orsaclinic@gmail.com), Answer the following questions:

- What is your name, email address, and age?
- Are you furnishing your own rifle and ammo? If you are, provide details to ensure CMP compliance. (just google CMP Highpower Rules)
- Or, Will you need a club AR-15(or M1)? (note, only club ammo may be fired in club rifles)
- Are you left-handed?
- Do you plan to attend the optional CMP Games Match Afterwards?
- You will then get a confirmation email which will have additional information.

Once have received your conformation email you must notify us before Wednesday before the clinic if you cannot attend so others may take your spot. If you do not provide a cancelation notice, your participation in future clinics will not be guaranteed.

### **The Day of the Class:**

- Schedule: Report to the ORSA Ed T. Johnson Indoor Range Facility at 8:00 AM Saturday.
- Firing will be complete by 4:00 PM.
- You will register, receive an introductory course of instruction and will be assigned a shooting relay and target number before being released to the high power range
- All firing will be conducted from the 200 Yard Line.
- Upon reporting to the firing line, you will be paired with a coach and fitted with a shooting jacket and glove.
- Upon reporting to the pits, you will learn target scoring procedures.

### **Fees (Cash or check made out to ORSA):**

- \$40.00 (\$60 for M1) for club rifle, ammo, and equipment
- \$10.00 if participant brings their own rifle, equipment and ammo

### **Range Requirements, Safety, and Comfort:**

- Space is limited,
- Eye and Ear Protection are required on all ORSA ranges and must be furnished by participants.
- Dress for the weather predicted, to include a hat and sunscreen. An inclement weather plan exists in the event of rain.
- **No Muzzle Brakes**, shooters and coaches are near each other on the firing line.
- **Bring plenty to drink, and a light lunch.**

This is a tough time to be a patriotic American who believes in the U.S. Constitution and has lived “the American dream.” What we have seen in America the last couple of years is nothing less than frightening. In my lifetime one of the things I have taken for granted is the safety and security of living in this once great country. While I feel safe and secure living here in East TN, what I see going on all across my country causes me pain and sadness.

A country is not a country without a border and we have a federal government who has abandoned enforcement of all border laws. This is allowing in anyone who wants to come to America with almost no vetting of their background. In the last couple of years 5-7 million people have come into and been distributed throughout the country. Venezuela boasted that they emptied their prisons and told the prisoners they had to go to America. So without a doubt, there are people among us that we have no idea of whether they wish to do us harm. What is occurring is an invasion of America, an invasion by the design of the federal government. There is no more critical time for Americans to be armed for self-defense than today.

Crime has been surging across America. Daily we see videos of criminals going into stores and looting to their hearts content. “We need gun laws to stop the carnage!” These shootings feed right into the gun control crowd’s narrative that “the Second Amendment needs to be abolished.”

There are enough constitutional conservatives in the U.S. Congress to prevent the leftist dream of a disarmed America from becoming a reality. But after the Nashville shooting the gun control crowd is trying out a new tactic. They want Biden to declare mass shootings a national emergency and then use executive action to ban “assault weapons.” Now this is novel and audacious...ALTHOUGH clearly unconstitutional. The whole of the gun control movement might soon get behind this and we’ll hear from the Hollywood experts, the weapons experts in the music industry, the

Constitutional experts in the mass media, and certainly the experts at the universities and the Democrat Party. What are we to do?

Our governors must be at the forefront of any and all solutions. All governors, but especially red state governors, need to consider nullifying federal laws and regulations not specifically authorized by the Constitution.

A good place for them to start is to read Thomas Woods’ book “Nullification: How to Resist Federal Tyranny in the 21st Century.” In this book, Woods reminds us that our Founding Fathers considered the nullification of unconstitutional federal laws by the states to be a check on a corrupt federal government. Of course, the media will portray any such moves as “extreme,” but the reality is that the massive semi-police state we now live in is far more extreme, has no constitutional authority, and never did.

In the end, what we need (desperately) is leaders at all levels of our republic who want to restore the vision of America’s Founders of a free and prosperous society in which every person has the potential to succeed.

This suggestion is not complex, and its most important ingredient is to start locally and elect state officeholders who have the guts to follow the Founders’ original vision of a decentralized government in which the vast majority of power is in the hands of the states. Local action can have a national impact, but only if we the people stand up and speak out.

If we are able to return to a semblance of a federalist model of governance as our Founders envisioned, businesses will once again flourish by leaving behind unruly federal regulations, we can stop the unconstitutional FBI from harassing our citizens, we can return our schools to local control, we can secure our borders, we can stop the sexualization of children, we can end restrictions on free speech, gun ownership, and religious freedom, and we can and should expect many other positive outcomes.

The Bill of Rights was ratified on Dec. 15, 1791 (a mere 232 years ago). These original 10 amendments were each elegantly crafted as well as visionary in their sustainability and simple application of common sense.

So, given the above framework and analysis, I want to finish by pointing readers to the 10th Amendment: “The powers not delegated to the United States by the Constitution, nor prohibited by it to the States, are reserved to the States respectively, or to the people.”

### **Biden Executive Order Outlawing Pistol Braces**

Under Biden’s executive order, law-abiding Americans must surrender, destroy, rebuild, or register as many as 40 million lawfully-owned braced firearms within 120 days, or face felony charges. Orders like this are going to be used to circumvent the Second Amendment.

### **Bill Lee calls Red Flag special legislative session for August 21, 2023**

On May 8, 2023, Governor Bill Lee’s office issued a statement that “he will call for the Tennessee General



Assembly to convene a special legislative session on August 21, 2023, to strengthen public safety and preserve constitutional rights.” He has also asked for the public to leave comments about his Red Flag Special Session on the state’s website. The Second Amendment threat is continuing!

In the press release, it was also stated that Bill Lee “will meet with legislators, stakeholders and Tennesseans throughout the summer to discuss practical solutions ahead of the special session.” At this point, Tennessee Firearms Association has not had any contact from Bill Lee’s office seeking input on this matter or seeking to arrange dates for TFA, which some might consider to be a stakeholder, to discuss the Governor’s proposals for Red Flag laws in Tennessee.

Some might find it concerning that Bill Lee is expressing a desire to “preserve constitutional rights” in light of the fact that Bill Lee was the primary proponent of his 2021 permitless carry law which he continues to mischaracterize as “constitutional carry”. Indeed, the state of Tennessee has recently entered into a settlement agreement in a federal court in which the state conceded that a substantive portion of the 2021 permitless carry law by Bill Lee (which was carried in the Legislature by Rep. William Lamberth and Sen. Jack Johnson) violated the Second Amendment, violated the Fourteenth Amendment and constituted a federal civil rights violation. Further, Bill Lee has made many promises on 2nd Amendment issues in the last five years that he has never fulfilled.

If there was any reason to believe that Governor Lee would be a unyielding defender of constitutionally protected rights, then his statement on May 8, 2023, might be assurance enough. However, based on what he has actually done or failed to do in the last five years, some might find it unacceptable that trust should be blindly placed on Bill Lee’s shoulders to enforce the protections mandated by the Second Amendment when there is no clear and convincing evidence that he can do so.

Further, there is some information coming from Legislative sources that several in Republican leadership are working to pressure or otherwise “persuade” the Republican members to “do something” when they are called into session by Bill Lee. Take for example, the two Republican leaders that helped Bill Lee to pass the unconstitutional 2021 permitless carry law. One news source recently released a constituent recording of Sen. Jack Johnson stating that any legislation that would be called a “Red Flag” law cannot pass unless it is “rebranded” presumably to trick or mislead the public until its too late. Other sources within the Legislature are reporting that Rep. William Lamberth is insisting that the House Republicans ‘do something’ apparently a reference to helping Gov. Lee and his proposed Red Flag legislation – although its not entirely clear if Rep. Lamberth would actually support a Red Flag law or if he, like Sen. Johnson, wants to make sure whatever is run is “rebranded” so that it accomplishes the same objective but under a different descriptive term.

Commit to meeting face to face and on phone calls with your individual elected officials to strenuously oppose any kind of Red Flag law. You can look your legislators up on this legislative page: Find My Legislator (<https://wapp.capitol.tn.gov/Apps/fml2022/search.aspx>). One call or meeting is not enough – bring it up every time you see them.

Contact your legislators through using the TFA’s email “call to action” tool for stopping Red Flag laws. Join TFA if you are not a member, renew if your membership expired. Join/Renew.

If you are already a TFA member you can make a supplemental member donation to TFA that will help us closer to session to engage in radio announcements, social media programs, etc., to spread the word about what Bill Lee and his both Democrat and Republican cohorts are trying to do.

You can make donations to the TFALAC (a state political action committee) which is raising funds to oppose the Red Flag proposal and which has the capacity to run ads and programs directly oppose any Red Flag laws and legislators supporting them.

Finally, share this information with all of your family, friends and social networks. Get the word out because it is going to require substantial effort by tens of thousands of Tennesseans and those in other states (who want to make sure Tennessee is not the “poster child” for Red State Red Flag laws to be imposed on them) to stop this attack on our rights.

There is no doubt that the Governor’s response to the Covenant shooting is to propose Red Flag legislation. What that really tells us is that Governor Lee is ignoring a constitutionally protected right and the United States Supreme Court because he thinks it is ok for him to do so if its for what he considers to be a good reason for government infringements.

Your involvement is critical to help stop Bill Lee’s proposed Red Flag legislation.

Please take action now and help the TFALAC (a state political action committee) raise funds for radio spots, social media campaigns, and other “get out the word” measures to stop Bill Lee’s insistence that the state of Tennessee should be taking guns away from lawful gun owners in violation of the Constitution.
