2024 Vintage Rifle Matches

ORSA is once again planning a full slate of CMP vintage rifle matches for 2024. Vintage rifle matches include Garand, Springfield, Vintage Military, and Modern Military (GSVM) matches, an M1 Carbine match, and Vintage Sniper Rifle Team (VST) matches. The club has AR-15 and M1 Garand rifles, jackets, and gloves you may borrow. Ammo is available at the matches.

For 2024, the CMP has introduced at least one new rifle eligible for Modern Military and they have introduced a whole new class of rifles for VST. These rifles are original or replica rifles from the 1954 to 1976 time frame.

2024 Rimfire Sporter Matches

Six CMP Games Rimfire Sporter matches are scheduled for 2024. What is Rimfire Sporter? A founding concept was to make this a match everyone could shoot by letting them use rimfire plinking and hunting rifles that many already own. The idea is to bring out your .22 rifle, have some fun, and work on your marksmanship skills. Most types of smallbore rifles can be used, whether they are semi-automatics or manually operated, with separate classes for telescopic and open-sighted rifles. Rimfire Sporter rifles are .22LR caliber and limited to 7.5 pounds (including sights and a magazine) and must have triggers that lift at least 3.0 pounds and must be configured as standard sporter rifles. No specialized shooting jackets or other performance-enhancing equipment is allowed. A sling and heavy glove are allowed. The club has target rifles with slings you may borrow. Ammo is available at the matches.

The Rimfire Sporter course of fire was modeled after the high-power rifle National Match Course. Three positions, prone, sitting or kneeling, and standing are used. The course includes both slow-fire and rapid-fire stages for each position. Rimfire Sporter matches are shot outdoors at 50 and 25 yards, and indoors using 50-foot reduced targets. Both indoor

and outdoor matches are planned, depending on time of year and range availability. Match bulletins can be found at <https://orsarandp.com/>

2. 25 February, indoors
3. 23 March, after Basic Rifle Clinic, indoors or outdoors at Competition Range
4. 24 March, indoors
5. 31 August, after Basic Rifle Clinic, outdoors
6. 13 October, after Carbine match, outdoors

At the end of each quarter:

- 09 March, EJ Indoor Range, 50'
- 15 June, Competition Range 5 Outdoor, 25/50yd
- 21 Sept, Competition Range 5 Outdoor, 25/50yd
- 14 Dec, EJ Indoor Range, 50'

Registration starts at 0830, firing will commence at 9AM.

Entry fee is \$5 per 900 aggregate (no pay out). Entries are limited to one relay of 12 competitors, advanced entries are encouraged. An attendance commitment notice should be sent to prevent cancellation. Excess entries will be notified. Score submission is optional for an extra \$5. Course of fire, a beginning 'single-stage' 10 round slow fire match will be allowed, if desired, before the 900. 1800 minimum will be shot [90 rounds each 22LR, Center Fire]; 2700 [90 rounds .45] is dependent on weather/participation.

Entry fee is \$1.00 per 30 round National Match Course [NMC] string of fire, four NMC's are generally run. This will include 3 targets and one scoring ticket. Shooting is limited to 10 competitors at a time on a first come first served basis. As a participant concludes, another may then step up to the line at any time. For league purposes, all current NRA/CMP Pistol Rules apply (Conventional/Precision), one (off-hand) handed shooting only. For 'practice', a two-handed hold is allowed. All new shooters will receive an initial assessment using a .22LR. Marksmanship, safety will be critiqued and if needed, basic instruction given. If the participant is unfamiliar with Bullseye 'One-Handed' shooting, they will use two hands, all shots must be 'on paper'.

Competition Range

As a reminder, the Competition Range is designed for practice and competition for Bullseye Pistol, Rimfire Benchrest, Smallbore Prone (rimfire), NRL22, and the Blackpowder/muzzleloader style events. It is not intended to be used for general plinking, sighting in your handguns or shotguns, nor centerfire rifles. We continue to have members place targets on the ground, not in the provided target holders in the concrete runways and shoot handguns. This activity tends to have the bullets strike the concrete areas that were constructed to hold target frames and damage them. We are installing additional cameras to be able to identify the users creating this damage and you will be asked to attend

the BOD meeting and plead your case to maintain your membership. Its very unlikely you will receive any compassion from the BOD due to the rules specifically prohibiting this activity and you risk losing your membership privileges. There is no exception for the use of handguns on this range outside of Bullseye Pistol practice and competition.

Civilian Marksmanship Program (CMP) Basic Rifle Clinic and Rimfire Sporter Match March 23rd and August 31st 2024, 8:00 AM – ORSA Ed T. Johnson Indoor Range Facility

We will meet at ORSA's Ed T. Johnson Indoor Range Facility on March 23, 2024, and August 31, 2024. Attendance at a basic rifle clinic is required before attending a highpower rifle clinic generally held the next month or later in the year.

The purpose of the clinic will be to introduce the basic marksmanship fundamentals, as well as introducing the other rifle shooting disciplines and competitions held at the ORSA High Power Range, and indoor ranges. Completion also enables qualified competitors to purchase rifles, ammo, and accessories authorized under the CMP Rifle Sales program (see thecmp.org for details). ORSA will host an OPTIONAL Rimfire Sporter Match immediately afterwards.

ORSA will provide a bolt action 22LR rifle, with ammo. With prior coordination, you may request to bring your own 22LR rifle, typically a Ruger 10-22 is adequate. If you are permitted to bring your rifle and ammo, cost is \$10.00. If you are using an ORSA rifle, ammo, and equipment; cost is \$20.00.

If you wish to participate, please read, and follow the instructions below.

RSVP to David Kiefer orsaclinic@gmail.com, Answer the following questions:

- What is your name, email address, and age?
- Are you furnishing your own rifle and ammo? If you are, what are you bringing?
- Or, Will you need a club rifle? (Only club ammo may be fired in club rifles)
- Are you left-handed?
- Do you plan to attend the optional Rimfire Sporter Match Afterwards.
- What are your goals for the clinic and marksmanship, and do you anticipate wanting to participate in the highpower clinic to shoot an M1 or AR Service rifle?
- You will then get a confirmation email which will have additional information.

Once you have received your conformation email you must notify us Wednesday before the clinic if you cannot attend so others may take your spot. If you do not provide a cancellation notice, your participation in future clinics will not be guaranteed.

The Day of the Class:

- Schedule: Report to the ORSA Ed T. Johnson Indoor Range Facility at 8:00 AM Saturday.
- Class should be completed by noon, the optional Rimfire Sporter Match will be complete by 3:00 PM.
- You will register, receive an introductory course of instruction, and will be assigned a shooting relay and target.
- All firing (approximately 40 shots) will be conducted at the 50ft indoor range, or the outdoor competition range if weather permits
- Upon reporting to the firing line, you will be paired with a coach.

Fees (Cash or check made out to ORSA):

- \$20.00 for club rifle, ammo, and equipment
- \$10.00 if participant brings their own rifle, equipment and ammo
- Fee for the Rimfire Sporter Match is \$10, plus ammo for club rifles is \$10.

Range Requirements, Safety, and Comfort:

- Space is limited,
- Eye and Ear Protection are required on all ORSA ranges and must be furnished by participants.
- Dress comfortably to lay in prone or sitting position.
- If you wish to stay for the Rimfire Sporter Match afterwards, **Bring plenty to drink, and a light lunch.**

At the same time America is in danger of an imminent terrorist attack, the Biden Administration is doing everything to disarm Americans. The White House has formed an Office of Gun Violence Prevention and is pushing states to form similar offices to coordinate gun control efforts in those states. Their priorities include “Red Flag” laws, increased background checks, eliminate individual-to-individual gun sales, allow law suits against gun makers, and create gun storage laws. All of us who believe in the Second Amendment and “shall not be infringed” need to be concerned.

While all of us feel lucky “that we live in freedom loving Tennessee” there is still a lot to be concerned with. We’ve already seen our so-called Second Amendment supporting governor try to enact “Red Flag” laws, the legislature still has a lot of work to do to protect our Second Amendment rights. We must communicate to our state legislators and the article below gives you an easy way to do it.

Tennessee Legislators need to support the effort to make Tennessee’s Constitution compliant with the Second Amendment.

The Tennessee Constitution violates the Second and Fourteenth Amendments. It must be amended as one of the steps to making sure that the rights that the United States Supreme Court has repeatedly held in *Miller*, *Heller*, *McDonald* and *McDonald* are vest in each of us are no longer in jeopardy under the “Jim Crow” amendment to the Tennessee Constitution that occurred in 1870.

How does the Tennessee Constitution violate the Second and Fourteenth Amendments?

The Second Amendment states in its operative phrase that **“the right of the people to keep and bear Arms, shall not be infringed.”** Tennessee’s constitutional provisions as written originally in 1796 was the closest to the Second Amendment’s prohibition on government action but it still reflected a restriction that the Second Amendment did not contain. The 1796 Tennessee Constitution protected the rights of the “free men” in Article 11, Section 26.

The “Jim Crow” effort took on more emphasis in the 1834 Amendment to the Tennessee Constitution which changed the phrase “free men” to “free **white** men”. Article 1, Section 26.

After the Civil War, the Tennessee Constitution was amended in again 1870. With that amendment, the language about “free men” and “white men” were eliminated but a phrase was added which purported to give to the state powers of equal unconstitutional purpose. In 1870, the language of Article 1, Section 26, the drafters added that **“the Legislature shall have power, by law, to regulate the wearing of arms with a view to prevent crime.”** That clause had the purpose to allow the state legislature to enact and continue Jim Crow laws under the pretext that they were crime prevention laws.

The Second Amendment has never contained language about “free men”, “white men”, any color, age, sex or national origin. It has never done anything but prohibit any government infringement of the right that pre-exists the constitution.

The United States Supreme Court’s decision in *New York State Rifle and Pistol Association v. Bruen* in June 2022 made clear that the prior practice, which federal district and appellate courts had developed, engaged in an “interest balancing” analysis where the courts would consider whether the governmental restriction had any reasonable purpose – such as crime prevention – even if the government restriction clearly

impacted a right within the scope of the Second Amendment. The Supreme Court made clear in *Heller* and made even more clear in *Bruen* that a government cannot under any circumstance justify the infringement of a constitutionally protected right by asserting that it is reasonable, that it is in the public interest, that it promotes public safety or that it advances crime prevention. As stated in *Bruen*, only those government restrictions that constituted part of the nation’s historical tradition as of 1791 (or close analogues) can pass constitutional scrutiny.

It is beyond debate that the current Tennessee Constitutional provision violates the Second and Fourteenth Amendments.

Some Legislators have proposed and are supporting a Constitutional amendment that would repeal the existing unconstitutional provision and substitute the phrase **“That the citizens of this State have a right to keep, bear, and wear arms.”** (See Amendment 1 to HJR0038 by Rep. Jay Reedy and SJR0904 by Sen. John Stevens)

As of February 11, 2024, many state legislators have co-sponsored these resolutions but many more have not. On SJR0904, Sen. Stevens is the sponsor and Senators Bailey, Bowling, Hensley and Jackson are the co-sponsors. But, there are 33 Senators and most of them are Republicans!

As of February 11, 2024, HJR0038 is sponsored by Rep. Jay Reedy. Representatives who have co-sponsored the amendment, in the order in which they are listed on the state’s website, are Todd, Sparks, Doggett, Slater, Barrett, Capley, Moody, Grills, Fritts, Cepicky, Martin B, Russell, Littleton, Moon, McCalmon, Keisling, Lamberth, Bulso, Boyd, Gant, Davis, Bricken, Richey, Darby, Hill, Garrett, Farmer, Hurt, Butler, Cochran, and Warner. Again, there are 99 House members and a super majority of them are Republicans.

But this is not a Democrat or Republican issue. First, the amendment seeks only to remove an unconstitutional provision from the state’s constitution. Second, the amendment would eliminate over 225 years of unjust prejudice in favor of “free” or “white” citizens rather than all citizens. Third, the amendment would at the state level make clear that the state legislators, local governments and others government decision makers are constitutionally prohibited from engaging in any “interest balancing” that the Supreme Court has said the Second Amendment prohibits.

Ohio Sheriff Sounds the Alarm After Meeting with FBI, Arms Deputies

“It’s not if they are going to attack, it’s just when they are.” That’s what Ohio’s Butler County Sheriff Richard Jones said after attending the National Sheriffs’ Association Conference in Wash DC held Feb 3-6, according to the Journal-News. At the conference, FBI officials warned sheriffs from across the country about imminent terrorist attacks on the U.S.

“There are people already here who have come to this country who hate us and want to kill us,” Jones warned. He’s on



a mission to make sure his department is prepared.

The new generation of terrorists is sophisticated. The FBI warned the sheriffs that terrorists could utilize cyberattacks to cripple power grids and cause train derailments. Cells of terrorists could target multiple areas of the country.

The sheriff's office is "getting five cyberhack attempts a day by the Chinese, three times a day by the Iranians, and we got hacked two years ago by the Russians," Jones said. "And that is not just us. I assume they are doing that all over the country."

The Chinese have the U.S. outnumbered 50 to 1 in people working on cyberattacks and prevention, Jones said. "Their deal is to cause us disruption in our county. To cause chaos in our country, not like next week — now. From the red flags and chatter that they (FBI) are hearing"

The FBI advised the sheriffs that people have already come across the border to "do harm to us...that they have never seen it this bad," Jones continued. Not just a handful either. Thousands of terrorists want to cause chaos across the country. According to Jones, this includes national and local elections.

"They told us we need to be prepared to talk to local county election people to be prepared. They want us to lose faith in our government," Jones warned.

To combat the danger, Jones urges state lawmakers to pass legislation in Ohio that allows felony charges to be filed against illegal immigrants, according to WXIX. Jones's call to arms is similar to a measure in Texas.

Jones also is calling for a state cybersecurity czar to protect government organizations from being hacked by terrorists. He also sees the need for a task force to secure Ohio's northern border because he says there is now an influx of drugs and weapons coming into America through the Canadian border. This is due to the manpower and resources moved to the southern border.

Terrorists won't strike only in big cities, according to Jones. They'll also target smaller cities and rural areas.

"The terrorists are here, we have already been told that, from 160 countries that want to do us harm," Jones warned. "We have been told by the FBI that they are here and it is just a matter of time before they attack."

"I am talking about people who want to attack Americans, and I would be a fool to think that is not going to happen. The national government can't take care of it all. There is more local police than FBI. It all comes down to preparing for it," Jones said.

Jones' department is preparing. All cruisers will be equipped with AR-15s and extra ammo, according to WXIX. Hazmat training will also be expanded.

Local law enforcement, however, can't do it alone. Jones announced that a training class for the public will be held in May, according to the Journal.

The course — "When Disaster Strikes: Prepare, Act, Survive" — will teach citizens in the community to prepare for disaster, survive it, and, when necessary, participate in search and rescue operations after a natural disaster or terrorist attack.

Biden-Harris Administration Ramps Up Its Campaign to Spread Their War on Guns to the States

Recently, we reported on the establishment of the White House Office of Gun Violence Prevention, an effort by the Biden Administration to funnel taxpayer dollars to the partisan project of gun control. Whatever else can be said of the office, it is at least trying to justify its existence by staying busy, to the

detriment of law-abiding gun owners.

Last week the office convened a meeting with democrat state legislators in an effort to dragoon them into enacting anti-gun policies that have failed to gain traction at the federal level. Even the U.S. Justice Department — supposedly the executive's guarantor of civil rights — is now drafting constitutionally dubious "model legislation" that states can use to crack down on gun owners. The effort shows Biden's weaponization of government for political purposes continues to sink to new lows.

White House propaganda characterized this meeting as part of the "Biden-Harris Administration's Safer States Initiative." The details of the initiative can be found in a brochure that lists various actions the White House wants states to take to promote the administration's goal of normalizing persecution of gun owners. The general thrust of the "initiative" seems to be that anti-gun officials can turn back the U.S. Supreme Court's development of Second Amendment doctrine and the public's increasing embrace of the right to keep and bear arms by mass, coordinated action in the opposite direction.

The outline of the administration's plan for state action is follows:

1. "Establish a State Office of Gun Violence Prevention";
2. "Invest in Evidence-informed Solutions to Prevent and Respond to Gun Violence";
3. "Strengthen Support for Survivors and Victims of Gun Violence";
4. "Reinforce Responsible Gun Ownership";
5. "Strengthen Gun Background Checks"; and
6. "Hold the Gun Industry Accountable".

The outline paints a picture of obvious gun control euphemisms interspersed with potential efforts at problem solving. But the details of the plan paint a different story, one replete with the same unconstitutional, failed, or — at best — unproven policies the firearm prohibition lobby has pursued for decades. Little of it has anything to do with crime or safety. Instead, most of it is squarely focused on making life more difficult for anyone who would dare own a gun or operate a firearm-related business.

Needless to say, most of the hardcore anti-gun states have implemented versions of these measures already. Meanwhile, moderate or pro-gun states are either not interested in them or (appropriately) have higher priorities for actually fighting crime. But it says something significant that the administration is willing to expend so much effort signaling to its supporters and donors how much they want to clamp down on the Second Amendment.

Gun owners should consider themselves warned.
