## 2025 Rimfire Sporter Matches

Six CMP Games Rimfire Sporter matches are scheduled for 2025. What is Rimfire Sporter? A founding concept was to make this a match everyone could shoot by letting them use rimfire plinking and hunting rifles that many already own. The idea is to bring out your .22 rifle, have some fun, and work on your marksmanship skills. Most types of smallbore rifles can be used, whether they are semi-automatics or manually operated, with separate classes for telescopic and open-sighted rifles. Rimfire Sporter rifles are .22LR caliber and limited to 7.5 pounds (including sights and a magazine) and must have triggers that lift at least 3.0 pounds and must be configured as standard sporter rifles. No specialized shooting jackets or other performance-enhancing equipment is allowed. A sling and heavy glove are allowed. The club has target rifles with slings you may borrow. Ammo is also available at the matches.

The Rimfire Sporter course of fire was modeled after the high-power rifle National Match Course. Three positions, prone, sitting or kneeling, and standing are used. The course includes both slow-fire and rapid-fire stages for each position. Rimfire Sporter matches are shot outdoors at 50 and 25 yards, and indoors using 50-foot reduced targets.

Both indoor and outdoor matches are planned, depending on time of year and range availability.

5. Sunday 14 September outdoors at Competition Range
6. Sunday 12 October outdoors at Competition Range

## Creedmoor Shoot Held at ORSA

nothing but your body to support the rifle. We did have an Open Class that allowed shooters the use of X-Sticks and slings as well as a Senior Class (over 70) that allowed support as well.

72 shooters registered for this Creedmoor 150, unfortunately 2 Hurricanes back-to-back caused 6 to cancel and 2 older shooters (age 86 & 89) could not complete the match. God Bless them as they were an inspiration to us all.

We shot at the original Creedmoor target, which had a square black bull, 4pts (36"), outer square in white, 3pts (72") and 2 wings, 2pts (24" each side for windage) - this was the 1000yd target. For 300y and 600y, I also made proportional sized targets ex: 300y was 30% of the 1000y target, 600y was 60% of the 1000y target. It was a fantastic week of shooting, and the weather could not have been better! The wind played some havoc, but at least it did not rain.

We had a practice day, but match days were not allowed any practice (like the original match), shooters had to adjust their Vernier sights to the settings they had used at practice, adjust for conditions, and go. 15 shots at each distance for score, total 60 points possible at each of the 3 distances. We did not have anyone clean the black with all 15 shots at any distance as we've had a few do so in the past (previous matches only 10 shots).. We did have a few 59 - X's/60 at 300 & 600 and 55-2x was the high score at 1000. Those that shot unsupported in the Traditional class were surprisingly not far off with a few 57's- X's at 300 & 600 and 51-1x being the high at 1000y.

Everyone was very complementary of the ORSA facilities and enjoyed the match (and weather).

THANK YOU to the ORSA R&P and BOD for sponsoring/allowing such historical matches to be held - it's our shooting history and many of the fascists of the original Creedmoor Match/Long Range shooting are still in use today..

For the ORSA members who have seen BP rifles being shot (1-2x/yr) on the HP line over the past ¼ Century, the much anticipated 150th Anniversary of the Creedmoor Match of 1874 was recreated the week of October 8-11 at ORSA.

The NRA of UK was established in 1859 for the Volunteer movement to teach citizens how to shoot to defend their country following the Crimean War. The NRA - USA was created in 1872 out of the NY Rifle Club and offered to host a rifle match with the famed British muzzleloaders. Americans with their newly developed breechloaders hosted the event at the Creed farm on Long Island NY (gone now). This part of the farm used for the match was in a marsh land - aka: moor. Hence the name Creedmoor.

The British rifleman, with their John Rigby Match rifles came to America and spent a month or more visiting, including hunting out west. Everywhere they went, people lined the streets to see them. The Creedmoor Match on Long Island brought spectators in by train - over 10,000. We did NOT have that problem in 2024 at ORSA!

We had shooters from all over the country + UK and New Zealand. Many of my oversea shooting friends did not make the costly (\$\$\$) trip - that is totally understandable.

We did, however have many of the same period rifles including a few original Rigby's, Sharps and Remington Rolling Blocks being used. This was our Traditional Class that used these specific rifles, and these rifles were shot UNSUPPORTED as they did in 1874 - no sling, no X-sticks,

## A Safety Incident As Told By The Member Involved

*The ORSA Board recently investigated an incident involving several safety violations on an ORSA range. The member was requested to come before the board and answer to explain his actions which resulted in these violations. His membership card/privileges were immediately revoked when the incident was reported. After appearing before the board, he was given a 90-day suspension from his appearance not to include his already suspension from the initial report. He was required to attend the new member Orientation. He is limited to one guest at a time on ORSA ranges. He stated he wanted this episode to be a learning experience, so the board required him to write an unsigned article detailing the incident so other members might learn from his errors. -ORSA Board*

My fellow ORSA members, today I want to write about an incident and injury that occurred in July of this year on the plinking range in the hopes that my experience will underscore the importance of vigilance, safety, and the importance of the rules and guidelines here at our beloved range. The accident was completely preventable and falls squarely on my shoulders as the ORSA member amongst my party.

To begin, I came to the range with my son, a significant other, her brother, his wife, and her son, all of which were new to ORSA, except for my son. Already, I had broken the guest policy which clearly states that members are allowed only to bring a spouse, children under 18, and an occasional guest. My son and the other boy were 15 and 14, respectively, and while my son is familiar with ORSA rules and gun safety in general, the other was not.

As we started shooting, I set the other boy up with one of my guns, showed him how to operate it, and let him begin shooting. He seemed to do well enough with the first gun, so a few minutes later I set up a different gun for him to shoot - this one without a stock to stabilize against his shoulder. I showed him how to hold it by the grip and the magazine below to stabilize it properly, and in a moment of carelessness on my part, I walked over to another bench to

talk to my other guest and prepare another gun.

Getting too comfortable and too lax on safety, I left the young man to shoot on his own while I was only feet away with my back turned. What I didn't see was that he chose to hold the gun by the grip and forend and pull it closer to his face to look through the optic. When he pulled the trigger, the recoil rotated the gun backwards and up and the optic hit him in the bridge of the nose, lacerating him. As he began to bleed, I scrambled to my truck looking for something for him to apply pressure to the wound and deal with the situation at hand.

Unfortunately, in a second oversight of safety and the chaos of what had happened, I neglected to take the gun from him. During the moment that followed, he was asked what happened, where he held the gun up again to demonstrate - but facing the parking lot of the range this time. Both his stepfather and I reached to push the gun down so it would not be in an unsafe direction, and at that time I took the firearm from him. In the end, the boy, his mom, and stepfather left to take him to a clinic, and he needed two stitches to close the wound.

The series of failures to adhere to safe protocols caused an injury and highlighted that I had grown too comfortable with these tools that ultimately can be dangerous even when one is behind the line. I should not have brought as many guests. I should have watched each guest and gauged their comfort with guns as well as ensured they followed both the rules of gun safety and the rules of ORSA. While I did talk to them about both of those things, I should have ensured they were following closely to those guidelines every time they stepped up to shoot. Our duty to our guests and the world of shooting sports is to ensure that new participants have a safe and positive experience, and that must come from experienced shooters who are underscoring the important values of the hobby. If any good can come of this incident, I hope it is that others can learn from my mistakes and that nothing should be taken for granted, especially when it comes to safety at the range.

Well, all the drama of the election is over and there is nothing before us but peace and prosperity. Hah, just kidding. The Left has already declared that they are forming “the resistance.” What does that mean for us? Biden is still in control of the executive branch and can issue more executive orders to further his gun control agenda. The Democrats control the Senate where the leaders have already declared that they are going to push for some legislation to combat their constant base rallying issue - “gun violence.” We will have to stay alert to any legislative actions before the inauguration and help our legislators keep a stiff backbone in opposition to any infringement to our Second Amendment rights.

Speaking of the inauguration, you know there will be massive protests as there were in 2016. The Left is already planning nation-wide protests. Let’s hope that legitimate, First Amendment protected, protests don’t turn violent.

So what should we expect with Donald Trump as president? Speaking at the NRA Convention in February he said that he “would defend the right to keep and bear arms and to make another push for concealed-carry legislation.” Trump also vowed to add more “conservative originalists” to the Supreme Court who would “interpret the Constitution as written.” This is great news for Second Amendment advocates.

Justice Sotomayor is part of the liberal wing of the Court and is in ill-health. Justices Thomas and Alito are in their 80’s and have signaled that they are ready to retire. Both are solid conservative originalists and supporters of the citizen’s right to keep and bear arms. Potentially Trump could have the opportunity to appoint three more justices to the Court. So in addition to cancelling all of Biden’s anti-Second Amendment Executive Orders, disbanding the White House Office of Gun Violence Prevention, President Trump can reshape the Supreme Court for a generation or more. President Trump could also take the U.S. out of the UN Small Arms Treaty where the Biden Administration has been working to undermine U.S. sovereignty and cancelling the Second Amendment.

Two more points. President Trump will appoint an Attorney General who will stop the weaponization of the justice system against gun owners, gun sellers, and gun manufacturers. And President Trump can appoint a new head of the ATF who can begin the process of either radical reform or elimination of the ATF.

It will be an interesting four years to be sure. The following is an article written before the election but its points are extremely valid.

### **Armed Self-Defense is the Key to Preserving All American Freedoms**

On May 20, 2024, Doug Hamlin was elected as the NRA’s new Chief Executive Officer and Executive Vice President. His election comes at a critical time for the NRA and gun owners across America, as the stakes for the upcoming 2024 presidential election could not be higher. In his first message to NRA members, published in the July 2024 issue of America’s 1st Freedom, Hamlin delivered a powerful message:

“We are resolute. We know our mission. We are all in this together . . . There has never been a more important time for us to get back on our feet than right now. The American people want their freedom. No, they demand their freedom. And now the NRA has righted its course . . . Now is the time to come together. Now is the time to be bold.”

Hamlin’s words were more than just a call for unity. They were a call for action. He emphasized that the future of American freedom, and specifically the Second Amendment, depends on what gun owners do in the coming months. His message—“Now is the time to be bold”—resonated deeply with those who understand that armed self-defense is the cornerstone of preserving all other rights.

### **A Dire Warning**

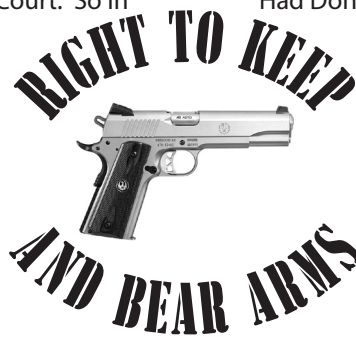
In the October 2024 issue of America’s 1st Freedom, Hamlin expanded on his concerns about the upcoming presidential election, making it clear that the stakes could not be higher. His remarks echoed those of countless other Second Amendment advocates who have long warned that the right to keep and bear arms is under attack like never before.

Hamlin’s address struck a particular chord with Stephen L. D’Andrilli, Co-Founder of The Arbalest Quarrel, who voiced his agreement in the magazine’s “Mail Call” section. D’Andrilli echoed Hamlin’s urgency, stating that if gun owners do not heed this call to action, “all is lost, forever.”

He and his business partners at The Arbalest Quarrel recognize that the liberties hard-fought and won in 1776 have been under assault ever since, and the battle has only intensified in recent years. The forces behind the Biden-Harris administration, D’Andrilli warns, have come dangerously close to achieving their goal: transforming the U.S. into a Marxist dictatorship, ultimately merging it into a global Marxist empire.

Had Donald Trump won the 2020 election, this Marxist trajectory would have been halted. But the 2020 election, fraught with unethical tactics and outright illegal strategies employed by the Democrat Party, ensured a victory for Joe Biden. Many gun owners made the fatal mistake of sitting out that election, and Hamlin and D’Andrilli agree that this must not happen again.

*“We need to vote and make sure all gun owners vote,” Hamlin said. “If we do, we will retain our freedom.” His message is clear: the upcoming election in November is the last chance for gun owners to turn the country around.*



### **The Second Amendment: A Keystone to All Freedoms**

In his July address, Hamlin described the Second Amendment as a “keystone” to American freedom. Without the right to armed self-defense, he warned, none of the other rights enshrined in the Constitution are secure. The Second Amendment allows Americans to defend their lives, their property, and their freedoms. Without it, every other right is in jeopardy.

Hamlin’s assertion strikes at the heart of the gun rights debate. While some may argue that other rights, like freedom of speech, take precedence, Hamlin rightly points out that the Second Amendment is what guarantees that those rights can be defended. Without the ability to physically defend oneself, freedom of speech and all other rights are hollow.

This perspective directly challenges those who downplay the importance of the Second Amendment. Even within the NRA, voices like John C. Sigler, a Board Member, have argued that the First Amendment holds more significance. In an October 7 article in AmmoLand Shooting Sports News, Sigler claimed that the First Amendment is the bedrock upon which individual freedom is built since it makes democracy possible.

However, D’Andrilli and his partners partially disagree with

Sigler's assessment. While freedom of speech is crucial, it is the Second Amendment that protects all other freedoms. As D'Andrilli succinctly puts it, "No, Mr. Sigler! You are wrong!"

The First Amendment is vital, but it does not stand alone. The right to dissent, to express one's thoughts freely, and to challenge government authority is ultimately safeguarded by the armed citizenry. Without the Second Amendment, the First Amendment and all other rights can be easily eroded by a tyrannical government. The Second Amendment is what ensures the balance of power between the people and the state.

### The 2024 Election: America's Last Chance

As we approach the November 2024 presidential election, the stakes could not be higher. Hamlin's message is clear: if gun owners do not turn out to vote for Donald Trump, the country will face a future in which freedom and liberty are extinguished. The forces working behind the scenes to support Kamala Harris are pushing a Marxist agenda that will destroy America's Constitutional Republic.

D'Andrilli echoes Hamlin's warning, stressing that this election is the last opportunity to preserve the Republic. "Rarely does a person get a second chance to undo a past horrible mistake," he says. "We, Americans, do have that chance now."

If Harris and her running mate, Minnesota Governor Tim Walz, win the White House, the Marxist takeover of America will be complete. The Constitution will be rewritten, the Bill of Rights will be eviscerated, and the free Republic will collapse into despotism and tyranny. Gun confiscation will be at the top of their agenda, and millions of Americans who cherish their right to bear arms will find themselves disarmed and defenseless.

However, there is still time to avert this disaster. As D'Andrilli points out, there are millions of gun owners across the country who have not yet registered to vote. If these gun owners register and vote in November, they can turn the tide of the election and ensure that Donald Trump returns to the White House.

### A Divided Nation

The battle for America's soul comes down to two opposing visions: one that embraces individualism, freedom, and the principles of the American Revolution and another that seeks to impose collectivism, control, and Marxism. Only one of these visions can prevail, and the outcome will determine the fate of the nation for generations to come.

Hamlin understands this reality all too well. His call to action is both a plea and a warning. If gun owners fail to vote in 2024, the consequences will be dire. There will be no third chance to reclaim the White House in 2028. The future of America hangs in the balance, and it is up to the armed citizenry to protect it.

As Hamlin states, "Your freedom is unequivocally on the ballot."

The NRA's mission has always been to protect and defend the Constitution, especially the Second Amendment. Since its founding in 1871, the organization has been the oldest civil rights organization in the United States, dedicated to ensuring that Americans retain their right to bear arms. Hamlin seeks to revitalize this mission and remind gun owners that their votes are crucial in preserving the Republic.

### The Power of the Armed Citizenry

Throughout history, it has been the armed citizenry that has stood as the ultimate check on government power. From the American Revolution to the present day, the right to armed self-

defense has ensured that the people remain sovereign over their government.

In contrast, collectivist regimes—like the one being pushed by the Harris/Walz ticket—have always sought to disarm the population, knowing that an armed citizenry is the greatest threat to their control. If gun owners fail to vote in 2024, they risk losing not only their firearms but also their freedom.

As D'Andrilli and Hamlin emphasize, the Second Amendment is not just about protecting other rights. It is an expression of freedom itself. The armed citizen is the embodiment of liberty, a living testament to the power of the individual to resist tyranny. Without this right, all other rights are vulnerable to government overreach.

Hamlin's leadership comes at a critical time for the NRA and the nation as a whole. His bold vision for the future of the organization and his unwavering commitment to defending the Second Amendment offer hope to millions of Americans who cherish their right to self-defense.

But this hope can only be realized if gun owners take action. The 2024 election is the last chance to turn the country away from the path of tyranny and toward a future of freedom and liberty. As Hamlin and D'Andrilli have made clear, the time for boldness is now.

*Gun owners must vote or risk losing everything!*

### Final Fight: The Choice is Ours

In the coming days, the future of America will be decided. Will we continue down the path of collectivism and tyranny, or will we reclaim the Republic and restore our freedoms? The answer lies in the hands of gun owners across the country.

Doug Hamlin's call to action is clear: vote and ensure that Donald Trump returns to the White House. Failure to do so will lead to the destruction of the Republic, the loss of the Constitution, and the end of the Second Amendment.
