

## Action Pistol Range Rules and Policies

### 28 October 2014

1. Only pistols and shotguns are to be used on the Action Pistol Range, except as noted in Item 2. Therefore, NO ARs or AKs are to be used at this range except as noted below.
2. The use of Rifles on the Action Pistol Range:
  - a. Cowboy Action can use period type rifles and shotguns with ammo permitted for use under their rules for practice and match competition.
  - b. Three gun matches are permitted. The rules set forth by USPSA, 3-Gun Nation, must be strictly adhered to. If the rules from another organization are proposed, the use of such rules must be approved by the Action Pistol Board.
  - c. Practice for 3-gun matches with a centerfire rifle is permitted ONLY in conjunction with a scheduled sanctioned 3-gun match provided there is a discipline sanctioned safety officer supervising.
  - d. Rimfire rifles, pistol caliber rifles (i.e. 9mm, .40, and .45 caliber) and shotguns that are allowed in approved Action Pistol disciplines, are allowed to be used on the Action Pistol Range for practice with Action Pistol approved targets only.
  - e. Ammo used for practice must not exceed what is used in the Action Pistol Disciplines.
  - f. Firearms may NOT be used in full-auto mode.
3. Targets: No Plinking of any kind is allowed.
  - a. Only approved targets may be used
  - b. Clay targets are not permitted for practice.
  - c. Clay targets may be used in a sanctioned match, but they must be cleaned up at the end of the match.
  - d. Throwing targets is prohibited.
  - e. The safety regulations of the respective Action Pistol disciplines regarding the distance steel targets will be engaged must be closely followed.
4. All participants and visitors must wear eye and ear protection during shooting activities.

5. The discharge of any firearm must be within the confines of the respective shooting bay, i.e. the shooter MAY NOT be beyond the open end of the bay.
6. Only one shooter will be permitted to shoot in a bay at the same time, except when there is a common firing line at a sanctioned event.
7. The safety regulations of the respective Action Pistol Groups must be followed to the letter.
8. None of the shooting disciplines may have permanent or portable props left in any shooting bay.
9. Any time a bay is setup for a match, it is prohibited to shoot or change the position or any props or targets unless authorized the discipline's Match Director.
10. When an organized match is in progress, unused bays MAY NOT be used for practice or setup unless permission is granted by the Match Director.
11. No permanent structures or buildings will be built or removed without the Action Pistol or ORSA Board approval. Non-permanent structures require Action Pistol Board approval.
12. Any training/for-profit activities, or special events must be approved and scheduled through Action Pistol Board and the ORSA Board; except for routine safety/orientation as provided by each discipline.
