## 2025 CMP Vintage Rifle Matches

ORSA is once again planning a full slate of CMP vintage rifle matches for 2025. Vintage rifle matches include Garand, Springfield, Vintage Military, and Modern Military (GSVM) matches, and Vintage Sniper Rifle Team (VST) matches. The club has AR-15 and M1 Garand rifles, jackets, and gloves you may borrow for GSVM matches. Ammo is available at the matches.

In 2024, the CMP introduced one new rifle eligible for Modern Military (SIG 550 series) and a new class of rifles for VST. These rifles are original or replica rifles from the 1954 to 1976-time frame including M70, M40, and XM21 rifles (CMP calls them "Vietnam era").

All matches are held on the Charlie Smart High-Power Range. ORSA is transitioning to electronic targets for high-power rifle events in 2025, please see the Rangefinder for news on this development.

## Civilian Marksmanship Program (CMP) Highpower Rifle Clinic and CMP Games Match April 19 & October 4, 2025, 8:00 AM – ORSA Ed T. Johnson Indoor Range Facility

If you have attended the Basic Rifle Clinic or Ed Johnson's 7-week small bore class and are interested in transitioning to shooting 3 Position Service Rifle, the CMP highpower rifle clinic is for you. We will meet at ORSA's Ed T. Johnson Indoor Range Facility on April 19, 2024, and October 4, 2025. Attendance at a basic rifle clinic is required before attending a highpower rifle clinic, or prior marksmanship training and evidence of prior competitive experience. The purpose of the clinic is to refine basic marksmanship fundamentals learned in the basic clinic, particularly the use of the sling and pit scoring operations. ORSA will host an OPTIONAL CMP Games Match immediately afterwards. In addition to having attended previous basic clinic, students should have some familiarity with the operation of an AR-15 or M1 Garand.

ORSA will provide your choice of an AR-15 or M1 Garand, with ammo. With prior coordination, you may request to bring your own US Service Rifle (AR-15, M1-Garand, or M-1A and ammo) provided it meets current CMP rules. If you are permitted to bring your gear, cost is \$10.00. If you are using an ORSA rifle, ammo, and equipment; cost is \$40.00 for use of AR-15, \$50 for the use of M1 Garand.

### If you wish to participate, please read, and follow the instructions below.

RSVP to David Kiefer [orsaclicin@gmail.com](mailto:orsaclicin@gmail.com), Answer the following questions:

- What is your name, email address, and age?
- Are you furnishing your own rifle and ammo? If you are, provide details to ensure CMP compliance. (just google CMP Highpower Rules)
- Or, Will you need a club AR-15 (or M1)? (note, only club ammo may be fired in club rifles)
- Are you left-handed?
- Do you plan to attend the optional CMP Games Match Afterwards?
- You will then get a confirmation email which will have additional information.

Once you have received your confirmation email you must notify us Wednesday before the clinic if you cannot attend so others may take your spot. If you do not provide a cancellation notice, your participation in future clinics will not be guaranteed.

### The Day of the Class:

- Schedule: Report to the ORSA Ed T. Johnson Indoor Range Facility at 8:00 AM Saturday.
- Firing will be complete by 4:00 PM.
- You will register, review the fundamentals of using a sling and the three firing positions, pit procedures, and then assigned a shooting relay and target number before being released to the highpower range.
- All firing will be conducted from the 200 Yard Line.

### Fees (Cash or check made out to ORSA):

- \$40.00 for AR-15 or \$50 for M1 Garand club rifle, ammo, and equipment
- \$10.00 if participant brings their own rifle, equipment and ammo
- Fee for the CMP Games Match is \$10.00 plus ammo if needed for club rifles, \$20.00 for AR-15 or \$40.00 for M1 Garand

### Range Requirements, Safety, and Comfort:

- Eye and Ear Protection are required on all ORSA ranges and must be furnished by participants.
- Dress for the weather predicted, include a hat and sunscreen. An inclement weather plan exists in the event of rain.
- Dress comfortably to lay in prone or sitting position. Bring a long-sleeved sweatshirt.
- **No Muzzle Brakes**, shooters and coaches are near each other on the firing line.
- **Bring plenty to drink, and a light lunch.**

So with a pro-Second Amendment supporter Donald J. Trump as President and Republican majorities in Congress, what can we, Second Amendment advocates, expect? Well one of big things for pro-Second Amendment supporters has been concealed carry reciprocity. Drivers licenses are recognized across state line, so why is a concealed carry not treated the same way? More importantly, why does the citizen have to have ANY government permission to exercise the citizen's right to keep and bear arms? The below article lays out the issue very well. Congressman Thomas Massie (R-KY), the most libertarian member of the House, is taking on this issue head on with his proposed legislation. We need to get our congressmen and Senators to support this legislation.

Does TN have real constitutional carry? We have a so-called Republican governor and Republican super majorities in both houses of the state legislature. The vast majority of TN citizens are supporters of individual liberty and freedom, especially of the freedom enshrined by the Second Amendment. So why are the governor and the legislature dragging their feet with regard to changing the TN constitution to align with the Second Amendment? I've included some information from the TN Firearms Association on this and recommend you contact the governor and your state legislators and let them know you views.

### **The importance of concealed carry reciprocity**

Over 86% of police chiefs and sheriffs support national reciprocity

Imagine a single woman driving across state lines at night, hoping she won't become a crime victim if her car breaks down. Or a truck driver as he travels across the country with valuable merchandise. They can quickly run into trouble in states such as California, Illinois, Maryland, New York, New Jersey or Oregon, among the 10 states that don't recognize concealed handgun permits from other states. Similarly, nine states don't grant or make it difficult for nonresidents to get permits.

A bill before Congress would change that and let people who can legally carry concealed handguns in their states carry them across state lines.

There are 21.5 million concealed handgun permit holders in the United States, which doesn't count people who carry in the 29 constitutional carry states where permits are no longer necessary.

Most of the country has reciprocity, allowing people to carry concealed handguns in other states. The average state allows people with concealed handgun permits from 30 other states to travel freely.

Permit holders are extremely law-abiding, losing their licenses for firearm-related violations at rates of thousandths or tens of thousandths of 1 percentage point. Police rarely commit crimes, but concealed handgun permit holders are even more law-abiding, with conviction rates for firearms offenses at just one-twelfth the rate of police.

Opponents argue that national reciprocity could lead to confusion about which gun laws apply in a given state, leading to arrests — but reciprocity is common. There is no evidence of a problem with out-of-state permit holders.

They also worry that the standards for getting a permit vary across states, but there is no evidence that permit revocation rates are higher in states where getting a permit is easier.

Despite all the fears of gun control advocates, there is a reason that more than 86% of police chiefs and sheriffs support national reciprocity. More than 90% of street police officers support concealed handgun laws. These are the people who see firsthand how reciprocity and concealed carry work. They know how important police are in deterring crime, but they also know that police almost always arrive at the crime scene after the criminal commits the crime and that self-defense is crucial to keeping people safe. Overwhelmingly, academic research finds that letting people carry concealed handguns reduces crime.

So much of the gun control debate is about things that might go wrong, but with reciprocity, we don't need to guess. With tens of millions of people legally carrying concealed handguns, if gun control advocates could point to hundreds or even dozens of cases where people with out-of-state permits caused problems, their concerns would be something to consider, but the problems are exceedingly rare.

Americans don't need to guess whether gun control advocates' concerns are justified.

Two groups that benefit the most from carrying guns are the likeliest victims of crime (poor Blacks in high-crime urban areas) and physically weaker people (women and the elderly). These groups have experienced the most significant percentage increases in concealed handgun permits over the past decade (2015 to 2024), with concealed handgun permits for women increasing 112% faster than for men and permits for Blacks increasing 284% faster than for Whites.

Unfortunately, real life isn't like the movies, where one woman can knock out and overpower several well-trained men. Even well-trained women often struggle to defend themselves against much larger and stronger men. Men also tend to be faster runners.

A firearm represents a much more significant change in a woman's ability to defend herself. Men can readily hurt women without a gun, and if a woman is already in physical contact with the attacker so he can take away their gun, they are already in trouble.

The peer-reviewed research by one of us shows that homicide rates decline when people carry concealed handguns, be they men or women, but a woman carrying a concealed handgun reduces the homicide rate for women by about three to four times more than a man doing the same.

Although the House is likely to pass national reciprocity, the battle in the Senate is much more difficult. To pass the bill in the Senate, 60 votes are required to break the filibuster Democrats will wage, and at least seven Democratic senators will have to break ranks. However, Democratic senators need only look at the experience in their home states to see no problems with reciprocity. Six states with 12 Democratic senators recognize concealed handgun permits from the rest of the country: Arizona, Georgia, Maine, New Hampshire, Vermont and Virginia. In none of those states has there been any movement to restrict reciprocity.

Police are extremely important, but 720,000 officers cannot be everywhere and protect 340 million people simultaneously. Let's ensure Americans aren't afraid to cross state borders.

### **REAL National Constitutional Carry Bill (H.R., 645)**

Congressman Thomas Massie (R-KY) has introduced the REAL National Constitutional Carry Bill (H.R., 645) to ensure every American, regardless of where they live or choose to travel to within our nation's border enjoys the freedom of Constitutional Carry.

If passed, Congressman Massie's REAL National Constitutional Carry bill would restore the right of all law-abiding Americans to carry a concealed weapon **WITHOUT**:

- Asking government officials "permission" to exercise your Second Amendment freedom to "keep and bear arms;"
- Being treated like a common criminal with intrusive "background checks: and fingerprint requirements;
- Filling out pages of paperwork, paying expensive application fees, and satisfying time-consuming training requirements, or;
- Adding your name to a government database of "permit holders"

REAL Constitutional Carry, H.R. 645, if you're legal to carry a handgun, you're legal to carry it concealed to protect yourself and your loved ones. Please contact your U.S., Representative and Senators and INSIST that they co-sponsor and seek roll-call votes and oppose amendments to limit or gut the REAL Constitutional Carry bill with anti-liberty, anti-freedom provisions like age restrictions, vast no-carry zones, training requirements, fees, permission slips or databases.

### **Amend Tennessee's Constitution to remove a provision that violates the Second Amendment's "shall not be infringed" mandate**

Tennessee has a constitutional problem. The problem is that Tennessee's Constitution, Article I, Section 26, which was last amended just after the Civil War, purports to grant to the Legislature the authority to regulate the wearing of arms. That provision clearly violates the Second Amendment!

Further, Tennessee's Republican legislators and the officials in Bill Lee's administration are operating under the delusion that this provision allows them to do exactly that.

Your voice is crucial in the fight to protect our rights. House Joint Resolution 53 (HJR53) is a vital step in ensuring that Tennesseans' constitutional right to keep and bear arms is preserved but more importantly that the Tennessee Constitution's unconstitutional provision be removed. We need your help to ensure HJR53 moves forward and becomes law, protecting our freedoms for future generations.

Sadly, a similar resolution was pending in 2024 and actually was approved by the Senate. Had it been approved by the House, it would have put the issue on the ballot for the voters in 2026. But, someone in the House, to borrow a phrase from Harry Potter - "those who shall not be named" - did not want this unconstitutional provision removed. The matter was blocked in the House in 2024. It is moving again but the soonest it can be put on the ballot for our vote is now 2030! You have to ask — Why?

Take action today and join fellow advocates in standing up for what matters.

We need your help to get this bill passed! Contact your legislators today and urge them to support HJR53. By sending a quick email, you can help protect responsible firearm owners from unjust penalties.

Finally, if you conclude that Tennessee's laws do not fully satisfy the Second Amendment's "shall not be infringed" mandate, call the Governor, call these Republican Legislative leaders, and call your own legislators and ask them "Why, why does Tennessee violate the Second Amendment?"

### **Why don't Tennessee's gun laws fully comply with the Second Amendment if we have a Republican Super Majority in the Legislature?**

A frequent question we receive is - why don't Tennessee's gun laws fully comply with the Second Amendment particularly since Tennessee has been under absolute and overwhelming control of Republicans since 2010?

There is no doubt that Tennessee has been under complete Republican control since 2010. The state has had two men who identify as Republicans - Bill Haslam and Bill Lee - as its governors. The Legislature has been dominated by a majority of individuals who identify as Republicans.

Since we are constantly told that Republican officials support the Second Amendment and will protect the rights protected by the Constitution, why does Tennessee not have REAL constitutional carry? Why does it have a law (TCA 39-17-1307(a)) that makes it a crime to carry a firearm (or a stick) with the "intent to go armed" anywhere, at any time, including in your own home or on your own property? Why is the "handgun permit" a defense to a criminal charge of illegally carrying a firearm with intent to go armed? Why does Tennessee have an incomprehensible matrix of rules concerning the available defenses to the numerous statutes that prohibit your possession of firearms in places like "public parks"?

Substantially all, if not all, of these restrictions are far more burdensome than the restrictions that existed in 1791 (when the Second Amendment was adopted). Indeed, almost three years ago the United States Supreme Court held that state laws regulating the rights protected by the Second Amendment are unconstitutional unless they are based on the "national historical traditions" of firearms regulation that existed in 1791 and, the Court said, the burden is on the state to prove that its laws meet that national historical tradition standard.

So, we have enough people who claim they are Republicans and who claim that they support the Second Amendment, so what is the problem?

Perhaps the failure of the State to achieve Second Amendment compliance since 2010 may evidence that the Governor and certain key legislators (including those in Leadership - i.e., Lt. Gov. Randy McNally, Speaker Cameron Sexton, and caucus leaders Sen. Jack Johnson and Rep. William Lamberth) apparently do not truly support the Second Amendment. Indeed, it could be found that, if they did truly support the Second Amendment that these Republican leaders could push through the necessary changes to Tennessee law quickly. Perhaps even in a "special session" called specifically for that purpose since recent history proves clearly that a special session can accomplish massive changes in the span of only a few days particularly if the "right" leaders are determined to effect the changes.

If you conclude that Tennessee's laws do not fully satisfy the Second Amendment's "shall not be infringed" mandate, call the Governor, call these Republican Legislative leaders, and call your own legislators and ask them "Why, why does Tennessee violate the Second Amendment?"
